Royal Ulster Constabulary (Amendment No. 3) Regulations 1985

The Secretary of State, in pursuance of section 25 of the Police Act (Northern Ireland) 1970(a), read with section 18 of the Administrative and Financial Provisions Act (Northern Ireland) 1962(b), and after consulting, in accordance with section 34(2) of the said Act of 1970, the Police Authority for Northern Ireland and the Police Association for Northern Ireland, and after taking into account the recommendations made by the Police Negotiating Board for the United Kingdom and furnishing that Board with a draft of the regulations in accordance with section 2(1) of the Police Negotiating Board Act 1980(c), hereby with the concurrence of the Treasury makes the following regulations:—

Citation, operation and effect

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Royal Ulster Constabulary (Amendment No. 3) Regulations 1985.

(2) These regulations shall come into operation on 1st February 1986 but shall have effect for the purposes of regulation 5, 6 or 7 from the date specified in the regulation.

Interpretation

2. In these regulations any reference to the principal regulations is a reference to the Royal Ulster Constabulary Regulations 1984(d).

Overtime

3. In paragraph (1) of regulation 20 of the principal regulations for the words "recalled between two hours of duty" there shall be substituted the words "recalled between two tours of duty".

University scholars

4. In paragraph 3(2) of Schedule 4 to the principal regulations for the words "£837" there shall be substituted the words "£885".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations.)

These regulations amend the Royal Ulster Constabulary Regulations 1984 (the principal regulations).

Regulation 4 increases the supplementary pay allowance for university scholars with effect from 1st February 1986.

Regulation 5 provides for increases of pay for senior police officers with effect from 1st September 1985.

Regulation 6 provides for all assistant chief constables to be paid on a single pay point with effect from 1st January 1986.

Regulation 7 provides for increases of pay for the chief constable and the deputy chief constable with effect from 1st March 1986.

Retrospective effect is authorised by section 18 of the Administrative and Financial Provisions Act (Northern Ireland) 1962.

Medicines (Pharmacies) (Applications for Registration and Fees) Amendment Regulations 1985

These Regulations have been made by the Secretaries of State respectively concerned with health in England, in Wales and in Scotland and the Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland, acting jointly, in exercise of powers conferred by sections 75(1), 76(1), (2), (6) and 129(5) of the Medicines Act 1968.
