ROAD TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES

Traffic Weight Restriction (Crockroe Road, Trillick) Order (Northern Ireland) 1991

WHEREAS the Department of the Environment has published a notice in compliance with Article 23(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a);

AND WHEREAS no objection has been received;

NOW THEREFORE the Department, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Articles 2(2)(b) and 22(1) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 and of every other power enabling it in that behalf and being satisfied that the road specified in Article 2 is unsuitable for use by certain classes of vehicles, makes the following Order:

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Traffic Weight Restriction (Crockroe Road, Trillick) Order (Northern Ireland) 1991 and shall come into operation on 16th June 1991.

Prohibition

2. Subject to Article 3 the use by vehicles exceeding 2 tonnes in weight, whether laden or unladen, of Crockroe Road, (Unclassified No. 1647), Trillick, is prohibited.

Exemptions

3. The prohibition in Article 2 shall not apply to vehicles being used in connection with the delivery to or collection from such lands abutting onto Crockroe Road of goods of any kind or in connection with public utility or emergency services.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order.)

This Order prohibits vehicles exceeding 2 tonnes laden or unladen weight from using Crockroe Road, (Unclassified No. 1647), Trillick.

Vehicles requiring access are exempted.

Any person who acts in contravention of the Order shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale (£400).

Traffic signs indicating the effect of the Order will in due course be erected on the road.
