**Certified Tourist Establishments (Visitors Register)
Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1992**

Made 18th March 1992

Coming into operation 1st April 1992

The Department of Economic Development, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 24(2) of the Tourism (Northern Ireland) Order 1992(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf and after consultation with the Northern Ireland Tourist Board, hereby makes the following Regulations:

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Certified Tourist Establishments (Visitors Register) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1992 and shall come into operation on 1st April 1992.

Particulars to be contained in a visitors register

2. For the purposes of Article 24(2) of the Tourism (Northern Ireland) Order 1992, each visitors register which the proprietor of a certified tourist establishment must cause to be kept shall contain the full name, permanent address and nationality of each person using the sleeping accommodation provided at that establishment and that person's date of arrival at, and date of departure from, the establishment.

Means of keeping a visitors register

3. A visitors register shall be kept in a written or printed form.

(This note is not part of the Regulations.)

Article 24(1) of the Tourism (Northern Ireland) Order 1992 requires the proprietor of a certified tourist establishment to cause to be kept a register of visitors using the sleeping accommodation provided at that establishment.

These Regulations prescribe the particulars to be contained in that register and the means by which it is to be kept.

Under Article 24(3) of the Tourism (Northern Ireland) Order 1992 a person who fails to keep a register of visitors in accordance with paragraph (1) of that Article and these Regulations commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 1 of the standard scale.
