The Lord Chancellor makes the following rules in exercise of the powers conferred by Article 123A (6) of the Planning (Northern Ireland) Order 1991(1):

Citation and commencement

1. These Rules may be cited as the Planning (National Security Directions and Appointed Representatives) (Amendment) Rules (Northern Ireland) 2006 and shall come into operation on 24th July 2006.

Amendment of the Planning (National Security Directions and Appointed Representatives) Rules (Northern Ireland) 2006

- **2.**—(1) The Planning (National Security Directions and Appointed Representatives) Rules (Northern Ireland) 2006(2) shall be amended in accordance with paragraph (2).
 - (2) In Rule 2(1) delete the definition of "electronic communication" in its entirety and insert— ""electronic communication" has the meaning assigned to it by section 4(1) of the Electronic Communications Act (Northern Ireland) 2001(3);".
