PART 1

1. In this Schedule—

"appeal" means an appeal under regulation 24;

"appellant" means a person who has brought an appeal;

"appointed person" means a person appointed in accordance with paragraph 2;

"hearing" means a hearing to which Part 2 applies; and

"the parties" means the appellant and the Executive.

2. The Department shall direct that an appeal shall be determined by a person appointed by it for the purpose and the Department shall notify the parties in writing of the name of the appointed person.

3. Before the determination of an appeal, the appointed person shall ask the parties whether they wish to appear and be heard on the appeal and—

- (a) the appeal may be determined without a hearing of the parties if both of them express a wish not to be heard as aforesaid; or
- (b) the appointed person shall, if either party expresses a wish to appear and be heard, afford both of them an opportunity of so doing, in which case the provisions of Part 2 shall apply.

4. An appointed person may give such directions as he thinks appropriate to give effect to his determination.
