**LEGAL AID AND ADVICE**

**Legal Advice and Assistance (Financial Conditions) Regulations  
(Northern Ireland) 2008**

*Made* - - - - - *8th March 2008*

*Coming into operation* - *7th April 2008*

*To be laid before Parliament*

The Lord Chancellor makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by Articles 3(2), 7(3), 22 and 27 of the Legal Aid, Advice and Assistance (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a) and now vested in him(b):

**Citation, commencement and interpretation**

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Legal Advice and Assistance (Financial Conditions) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2008 and shall come into operation on 7th April 2008.

(2) In these Regulations, “the Order” means the Legal Aid, Advice and Assistance (Northern Ireland) Order 1981.

**Revocation**

2. The Legal Advice and Assistance (Financial Conditions) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2007(c) are hereby revoked.

**Persons eligible for advice and assistance**

3. For the weekly sum of “£215” specified in Article 3(1) of the Order(d) there shall be substituted the weekly sum of “£223”.

**Contributions from persons receiving advice and assistance**

4. For the weekly sum of “£91” specified in Article 7(2) of the Order(e) there shall be substituted the weekly sum of “£95”.

## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

*(This note is not part of the Regulations)*

These Regulations amend the Legal Aid, Advice and Assistance (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 so as to:

- (a) increase the upper income limit to make legal advice and assistance available to those with disposable income of not more than £223 a week (instead of £215);
- (b) increase the lower income limit below which legal advice and assistance is available without payment of a contribution to £95 a week (instead of £91).

No changes are made to the capital limits.
