The Foyle Area (Licensing of Oyster Fishing) Regulations 2008

**Interpretation**

**3.** In these Regulations—

“dredge” means a towed device used for the collection of molluscs from the seabed;

“Lough Foyle” means those waters in the Foyle Area bounded on the north or seaward side by an imaginary straight line drawn between Greencastle Fort in the County of Donegal and the Martello Tower at Magilligan Point in the County of Londonderry and bounded on the south by the defined mouth of the River Foyle;

“oyster” means a bivalve mollusc of the species *Ostrea Edulis*;

“oyster fishing licence” means a licence issued pursuant to regulation 7.
