# The Business Tenancies (Coronavirus) (Restriction on Forfeiture: Relevant Period) (Northern Ireland) Regulations 2021

The Department of Finance, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 83(7) of the Coronavirus Act  $2020(\mathbf{a})$ , makes the following Regulations.

### Citation, commencement and interpretation

**1.**—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Business Tenancies (Coronavirus) (Restriction on Forfeiture: Relevant Period) (Northern Ireland) Regulations 2021 and come into operation on 29th March 2021.

(2) The Interpretation Act (Northern Ireland) 1954(**b**) applies to these Regulations as it applies to an Act of the Assembly.

#### Extension of "relevant period"

**2.** For the purposes of the definition of the relevant period in section 83(7) of the Coronavirus Act 2020, the relevant period ends on 30th June 2021.

#### Revocation

**3.** The Business Tenancies (Coronavirus) (Restriction on Forfeiture: Relevant Period) (Northern Ireland) (No. 3) Regulations 2020(c) are revoked.

### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

### (This note is not part of the Regulations)

Section 83 of the Coronavirus Act 2020 provides that a right of re-entry or forfeiture, under a relevant business tenancy, for non-payment of rent may not be enforced, by action or otherwise, during the relevant period.

Regulation 2 provides that, further to previous statutory extensions, the relevant period is now extended to 30th June 2021.

Regulation 3 revokes the Business Tenancies (Coronavirus) (Restriction on Forfeiture: Relevant Period) (Northern Ireland) (No. 3) Regulations 2020.
