EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM TO

The Dungannon Road, Portadown (Abandonment) Order (Northern Ireland) 2024

SR 2024 No. 53

1. Introduction

- 1.1. This Explanatory Memorandum has been prepared by the Department for Infrastructure to accompany the Statutory Rule (details above) which is laid before the Northern Ireland Assembly.
- 1.2. The Statutory Rule is made under Article 68(1) and (5) of The Roads (Northern Ireland) Order 1993 and is subject to the negative resolution procedure.

2. Purpose

- 2.1. The purpose of the rule is to abandon an area of 235 square metres of road adjacent to No. 199 Dungannon Road, Portadown at Birches Roundabout, junction 12 of the M1 Motorway.
- 2.2. On the coming into operation of the rule, the Department will no longer be responsible for maintenance of the area of road in question and the public right of way over it shall be extinguished.

3. Background

3.1. The area of land to be abandoned is owned by the Department for Infrastructure and the Department of Finance. The proposal has been requested following receipt of an adverse possession claim and subsequent advice from Departmental Solicitor's Office (DSO) confirming that the claim cannot be progressed until this area of road has been abandoned as a road cannot be adversely possessed. Following the abandonment, the land owned by DfI will be declared surplus and disposed of in accordance with the statutory procedures laid down for the disposal of government owned land.

4. Consultation

- 4.1. The PSNI has been consulted and has no objection. Armagh, Banbridge and Craigavon Borough Council has also been notified of the proposed abandonment but has not commented.
- 4.2. In accordance with the statutory consultation process, a notice in respect of the proposed abandonment was published in the local press for two successive weeks. In addition, a notice was posted on site and the statutory undertakers were notified of the proposal.
- 4.3. Following the advertisement of the notice in the local press, no objections were received.

5. Equality Impact

5.1. Consideration has been given to compliance with Section 75 of the Northern Ireland Act 1998. No equality issues have been identified by the

Department and no issues were raised following the publication of the notice in the press.

6. Regulatory Impact

6.1. A Regulatory Impact Assessment was not considered necessary as the proposal does not result in any costs or savings to business, charities or voluntary bodies.

7. Financial Implications

7.1. Spend will be incurred in 2023-24 and relates to departmental staff costs as well as any physical infrastructure costs, for which there is sufficient budget.
