## Prisoners Detained in any of His Majesty's Prisons by Order of the Civil Authority.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS AS TO PRISONERS DETAINED IN ANY OF H.M. PRISONS UNDER THE CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL POWERS) ACT, 1922, AND REGULATION 23 THEREUNDER.

## 1922. No. 85.

- I, the Right Honourable Sir Richard Dawson Bates, Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, being the Civil Authority under the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Act (Northern Ireland) 1922, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the said Act and the Regulations made thereunder and of all other powers me thereunto enabling do hereby direct that every prisoner detained in any of His Majesty's Prisons by order of the Civil Authority under Regulation 23 of the said Regulations shall be detained upon the following conditions, that is to say:—
- 1. A prisoner may not procure for himself food or intoxicating liquor except on the order of the Prison Medical Officer.
- 2. A prisoner while so detained shall not be permitted to be visited without the sanction of the Civil Authority.
- 3. With the exception of communications sent bona fide as instructions to a Solicitor no communications may be sent by a prisoner except post cards, which shall be supplied for the use of prisoners by the Governor to such an extent as he considers reasonable. All communications from or to a prisoner shall be examined by the Governor or an officer of the prison appointed by him for the purpose.

Save as hereinbefore directed every prisoner detained under Regulation 23 aforesaid shall be detained upon the conditions provided for in the Prison Rules applicable to prisoners awaiting trial.
