Employment under Local and Public Authorities.

MADE BY THE NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE JOINT COMMITTEE AND THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR FOR NORTHERN IRELAND, ACTING JOINTLY UNDER PARAGRAPH (d) OF PART I OF THE FIRST SCHEDULE TO THE NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACT, 1924 (14 & 15 GEO. 5, c. 38).

The National Health Insurance Joint Committee and the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland, acting jointly, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by paragraph (d) of

Part I. of the First Schedule to the National Health Insurance Act, 1924 (14 and 15 Geo. 5, c. 38) (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), and by Article 5 of the National Health Insurance (Joint Committee) Regulations, 1924, hereby make the following Order :—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Employment under Local and Public Authorities) Order (Northern Ireland), 1925, and shall have effect as from 4th January, 1926.

(2) In this Order the expression "Office" includes any office, situation, or employment and the expression "pensionable office" means an office coming within the provisions of any Act authorising the grant of a superannuation allowance. In relation to employment the expression "permanent capacity" does not include any employment in which the employed person is liable to dismissal at less than one month's notice.

(3) The Interpretation Act, 1921, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. Employment of any class specified in the Schedule to this Order under any local or other public authority shall be deemed not to be employment within the meaning of the Act.

3. The National Health Insurance (Employment under Local and Public Authorities) Order (Northern Ireland), 1924 (S.R. & O. of N. I., 1924, No. 100), is hereby revoked, but without prejudice to any right, privilege, obligation or liability acquired, accrued or incurred thereunder.

SCHEDULE.

Employment under any Local or Other Public Authority :—

- (a) In any pensionable office in a permanent capacity ;
- (b) As chaplain or other minister of religion ;
- (c) As duly qualified medical practitioner ;
- (d) As coroner or deputy coroner ;
- (e) As public analyst ;
- (f) As public vaccinator ;
- (g) As registrar, assistant registrar, or deputy registrar of Births, Marriages, and Deaths ;
- (h) Under a contract of apprenticeship without money payment ;

Employment under a Board of Guardians :— *

- (a) As a pauper ;
- (b) In rearing boarded-out pauper children.

Employment under any Local or other Public Authority not being employment within the meaning of Part I. (a), (b), (c) or (e) of the First Schedule to the Act, in the execution of contracts not requiring personal service on the part of the employed person.

Employment as a pilot under the Londonderry Port and Harbour Commissioners.

Expenses of Medical Certification.

MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER THE NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1924 (14 & 15 GEO. 5, C. 16).

The Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland in exercise of the powers conferred on it by the National Health Insurance Act (Northern Ireland) 1924 (14 & 15 GEO. 5, CH. 16) and of all other powers enabling it on that behalf hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Expenses of Medical Certification) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1925.

2.—(1) The sum to be paid to the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland (in these Regulations referred to as “the Ministry”) for the purpose of defraying the expenses of Medical Certification in accordance with the provisions of Sub-Section (1) of Section 1 of the National Health Insurance Act (Northern Ireland), 1924 (14 & 15 Geo. 5, Ch. 16) (in these Regulations referred to as “the Act”) shall subject as in hereafter provided be at the yearly rate of two shillings in respect of each of the total number of insured persons resident in Northern Ireland and being members of Approved Societies.

(2) In the event of the sum prescribed in paragraph (1) of this Article being more than sufficient for the purpose for which it is required the excess shall be recredited to the Income Account
