In pursuance of the powers conferred upon the Ministry of Finance (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") by Section 29 of the Representation of the People Act, 1918, as that Act applies to Northern Ireland under the provisions of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and of any Order made by His Majesty in Council under the last-mentioned Act, the Ministry hereby prescribes that the following alteration shall be made in the Regulations dated 12th March, 1925, prescribing a scale of maximum charges of Returning Officers at elections of the full number of

members of the House of Commons of Northern Ireland.
Regulation "B" (3) (c) shall read as follows:—

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE PHARMACEUTICAL SOCIETY OF NORTHERN IRELAND PURSUANT TO THE 3RD SECTION OF "THE PHARMACY AND POISONS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1925.

No. 161. 1925.

1. The Common Seal of the Society shall consist of a hand in a circle divided into six parts elaborated and with the Legend "Seal of the Pharmaceutical Society of Northern Ireland MCMXXV."

- 2. The affixing of the Common Seal shall be attested by the Signatures of the President and Vice-President.
- 3. The fee to be charged for Registration under the Act shall be five shillings in the case of a Pharmaceutical Chemist, Chemist and Druggist, or Certified Assistant to a Pharmaceutical Chemist who is registered in the existing Register; and in the case of persons who are entitled to be registered as Apprentices under Section 7, sub-section 5 of the Act, the fee to be charged for registration shall be five shillings.
