

Landing of Carcasses Order of 1926.

MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE FOR NORTHERN IRELAND IN VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS VESTED IN IT UNDER THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACT, 1894.

1926. No. 56.

Prohibition of landing of the carcasses of Cattle, Sheep, Swine and Goats.

1. From and after the commencement of this Order it shall be unlawful to land in Northern Ireland the carcase of any cattle, sheep, swine and goats brought from any European country outside Great Britain, Irish Free State, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man.

Exception.

2. This Order shall not apply to the carcase of any cattle, sheep, swine and goats, the importation of which into Northern Ireland is authorised by a Licence granted by the Ministry under this Order.

Interpretation.

3. In this Order—

“The Ministry” means the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland.

“Carcase” means the carcase of any cattle, sheep, swine or goats and includes part of the carcase, and the meat, bones, hide, skin, hoofs, horns, offal or other part of an animal, separately or otherwise, or any portion thereof.

“Sheep” includes lambs.

Offences.

4. If any carcase shall be landed in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof and the owner and lessee and the occupier of the place of landing, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the landing and the owner or charterer, and the Master of the Vessel from which the same is landed, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall take immediate effect.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the Landing of Carcasses Order of 1926.
