

Landing of Plants (Northern Ireland) Order, 1926.

MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE FOR NORTHERN IRELAND, IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS VESTED IN IT UNDER THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACT, 1894, AS AMENDED.

1926. No. 69.

Destruction of packing materials.

1. Any person who imports into Northern Ireland any plant, which has originated in any European country outside Great Britain, the Irish Free State, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, shall immediately such plant has been unpacked destroy, by burning or other suitable method, any materials used for the packing of the imported plant.

Hay or Straw used for packing imported merchandise.

2. Nothing in this Order shall affect or modify as regards Northern Ireland the provisions of the Foreign Hay and Straw (Ireland) Order of 1912, as amended by the Hay and Straw (Ireland) Order of 1912, Amendment (Northern Ireland) Order, 1925.

Definitions.

3. In this Order the expression "plant" shall include tree and shrub and the tubers, bulbs, layers, or other parts of the plant.

Offences.

4. Every person who fails to comply with the provisions of this Order shall, according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Extent.

5. This Order extends to Northern Ireland.

Commencement.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1926.

Short Title.

7. This Order may be cited as the Landing of Plants (Northern Ireland) Order, 1926.
