

- (2) The said officer shall forthwith transmit every such report to the Secretary of the Ancient Monuments Advisory Committee at the office of the Ministry of Finance, together with such observations upon the report as may appear to the said officer to be relevant.
- (3) The Ancient Monuments Advisory Committee shall report to the Ministry of Finance, in relation to the finding of any archæological object, all such facts as may enable the said Ministry to decide whether the object so found should be purchased, or assistance be given towards the purchase thereof, for the purpose of public exhibition in accordance with the said section.

Performing Animals.

MADE BY THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER SECTION 5 (2) OF THE PROTECTION OF ANIMALS (MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1926.

1927. No. 37.

Form of Application for Registration (Section 1 (2)).

1 Every application for registration under the Act shall be made in writing to the Inspector General, Royal Ulster Constabulary, Belfast, in the form, and shall contain the particulars set out in the First Schedule hereto.

Form of Register (Section 1 (2)).

2 The Register which the Inspector General, Royal Ulster Constabulary, is required to keep shall be in the form set out in the Second Schedule hereto. Each registration shall be given a serial number according to the order in which it is made and the serial number shall be inserted in the Certificate of Registration issued to the Applicant.

3 The Inspector General, Royal Ulster Constabulary, shall keep as part of the Register an alphabetical index of the names of persons registered.

Form of Certificate of Registration (Section 1 (4)).

4 The Certificate of Registration which the Inspector General, Royal Ulster Constabulary, is required to issue to each registered person shall be in the form set out in the Third Schedule hereto.

Application for Variation of Registered Particulars (Section 1 (6)).

5 Applications for the variation of the registered particulars shall be made in the form set out in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

Certified Copy of Certificate of Registration.

6 The Inspector General, Royal Ulster Constabulary, may issue a certified copy of any certificate of registration issued by him if satisfied that the original has been destroyed or lost, and may charge therefor the fee hereinafter prescribed: provided that such certified copy shall be issued only to the person to whose registration it relates.

Inspection of Register Entries (Section 1 (5)).

7 The copy of the Certificate of Registration sent by the Inspector General, Royal Ulster Constabulary, to the Ministry of Home Affairs, shall be open to inspection on payment of the prescribed fee on each day on which the office is open between the hours of 10 a.m. and 1 p.m., and, except on Saturday, between the hours of 3 p.m. and 5 p.m.

8 The Register shall be open for inspection on payment of the prescribed fee at the Office of the Inspector General, Royal Ulster Constabulary, Belfast, on each day on which the Office is open, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 1 p.m., and, except on Saturday, between 3 p.m. and 5 p.m.

9—(a) The following fees shall be payable to the Inspector General, Royal Ulster Constabulary:—

For each Registration where the person applying for registration is not registered in Great Britain under the Performing Animals (Regulation) Act, 1925	21/-
For each Registration where the person applying for registration can show that registration has already been effected in Great Britain under the Performing Animals (Regulation) Act, 1925	10/6
For the issue of a copy of a certificate of registration	5/-
For each inspection of the Register kept by the Inspector General, Royal Ulster Constabulary	1/-

For taking copies or making extracts from a Register in respect of each registered person 1/-

(b) The following fee shall be payable to the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland :—

NOTE.—The fee payable in respect of the registration of a person under the Act is 2ls., which should be remitted with the application. If the applicant is already registered in Great Britain under the Performing Animals (Regulation) Act, 1925, the fee payable is 10s. 6d.
