**Sheep Dipping (Northern Ireland) Order of 1927.**  
(dated 15th July, 1927).

MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACT, 1894, AS AMENDED.

*Prescribed Period of Immersion of Sheep in an Approved Sheep Dip:*

1.—(1) Where, by any Order or Regulation in force in Northern Ireland, the dipping of sheep is required, the sheep shall be dipped by a thorough immersion of the whole body, including the head and ears, in a Sheep Dip approved by the Ministry for Sheep Scab and Sheep Dipping, or purporting to be so approved. The immersion, except as regards the head and ears, shall be for a period of not less than one minute.

(2) In the note to the Second Schedule to the Sheep Scab (Ireland) Order of 1905 relating to the required period of immersion in certain Sheep Dips approved by the Ministry for Sheep Scab, the words "one minute" shall be substituted for the words "half a minute," and the said Order shall be read and have effect accordingly.

### Transit of Animals.

MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACT, 1894.

1927. No. 38.

*Interpretation.*

1 In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires:—

"Animals" except where it is otherwise expressly stated, means cattle, sheep, goats, all other ruminating animals, and swine;

"Approved" means approved by the Ministry;

"Approved Disinfectant" means *either* a five per cent. solution of standard phenol, *or* a disinfectant prescribed by the Ministry for the purposes of the Animals Disinfection (Northern Ireland) Order of 1927;

"Cattle" means bulls, oxen, cows, heifers, springers and calves;

"Springer" means a cow or heifer heavy in calf;

"Dealer" means a person habitually engaged in the trade or business of buying or selling animals (other than animals bred by him) but does not include a person who as auctioneer sells animals which are the property of another person;

"Disease" except where it is otherwise expressly stated, means anthrax, cattle-plague (that is to say rinderpest, or the disease commonly called cattle plague), contagious pleuropneumonia of cattle, foot-and-mouth disease, sheep-pox, sheep-scab and swine fever;
