- (b) Employment within the meaning of the Unemployment Insurance Acts as in force in Great Britain or Northern Ireland as a master, seaman or apprentice to the sea service and sea-fishing service;
- (c) Any other cause which, in the opinion of the Minister of Labour, was in all the circumstances reasonable.
- 2.—(I) These Regulations may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Residence Condition) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1928, and shall have effect as from the 19th April, 1928.
- (2) The Interpretation Act, 1921, applies to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE (REVIEW OF CLAIMS) REGULA-TIONS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1928, DATED JUNE 27, 1928, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT, 1920 (10 AND 11 GEO. 5, C. 30).

The Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland by virtue of the powers conferred on it by Section 35 of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, as adapted to Northern Ireland by the Government of Ireland (Adaptation of Unemployment Insurance Acts) Order, 1922, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf hereby makes the following Regulations:—

- 1. For the purposes of sub-section (2A) of Section 11 of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920:
  - (a) The period therein specified shall, in relation to any insured contributor, be reckoned as beginning either on the first day of the preceding benefit quarter or the day next following that on which the claim of that insured contributor was last reviewed by the Court of Referees or the day three months prior to that on which the benefit year began, whichever of such days is the latest:

Provided that where any benefit quarter begins on or after the 19th April, 1928, but before 19th July, 1928, the said period shall not be reckoned as beginning earlier than on the first day of that benefit quarter.

- (b) The said period shall, in relation to any insured contributor, be reckoned as ending on the day on which that insured contributor shall have received benefit for periods amounting in the aggregate to thirteen weeks since the beginning of the said period.
- 2. These Regulations may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Review of Claims) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1928, and shall come into operation on the nineteenth day of July, 1928.
