

STREET TRADING.

THE STREET TRADING REGULATIONS, 1929, DATED THE 17TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1929, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS.

1929. No. 102.

The Ministry of Home Affairs, in exercise of the powers vested in it by the Street Trading (Regulation) Act (Northern Ireland), 1929, hereby makes and prescribes the following Regulations:—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Street Trading Regulations, 1929.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, as applied to Northern Ireland by the Interpretation Act, 1921, shall apply for the purpose of the Interpretation of these Regulations as it applies for the purpose of the Interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. The Licence to be used by local authorities under the Street Trading (Regulation) Act (Northern Ireland), 1929, shall be in the form in the Schedule hereto, or in a form to the like effect.

3.—(1) Where a local authority resolve to purchase compulsorily or extinguish market rights under Section 10 of the Street Trading (Regulation) Act (Northern Ireland), 1929, they shall publish notice of the resolution once at least in each of two successive weeks in one or more of the newspapers circulating in their area.

(2) The local authority shall also give notice of the resolution to the persons in whom the market rights are for the time being vested, or to such of the said persons as are known to the local authority, in the following manner:—

- (a) By delivering the notice personally to each person to whom it is required to be given, or if such person is absent abroad or cannot be found, to his agent; or
- (b) By leaving the same at the usual or last known place of abode of such person, or his agent; or
- (c) By forwarding the same by post in a prepaid and registered letter, addressed to the usual or last known place of abode of such person, or his agent; or
- (d) Where the notice is required to be given to a body corporate or company, by delivering the same to their Secretary or leaving the same at his office with some person employed there, or by forwarding the same by post in a prepaid and registered letter, addressed to such Secretary at his office.

4. The Local Authority shall give notice of the making and effect of any Order of the Ministry of Home Affairs approving of a resolution to purchase compulsorily or extinguish market rights

to the persons in whom the market rights were vested at the time the Order of the Ministry was made, or to such of the said persons as are known to the local authority, and the notice shall be given to such persons as aforesaid in the same manner as notice of a resolution is required to be given by the immediately preceding Article of these Regulations.

FORM OF LICENCE.

This licence is granted on the condition that the holder shall trade solely in the articles or things, and in the manner, and at the places and times specified in the Schedule to this Licence, and is also granted subject (1) to the provisions of any Bye-laws made by the *Commissioners Council under Section 6 of the Street Trading (Regulation) Act (Northern Ireland), 1929; and (2) to any other statutory provision which is in force for the time being.

The Licence, unless sooner revoked, shall continue in force until....., and on expiry or revocation shall be surrendered to the *Commissioners Council.

This Licence may be revoked by the *Commissioners if on account of misconduct or any other sufficient reason the holder is in the opinion of the *Commissioners unsuitable to hold it or the space available in the streets specified Council is insufficient.

Any person aggrieved by a refusal, revocation or variation of or any condition in the licence may appeal to a Court of Summary Jurisdiction constituted of a Resident Magistrate sitting alone or with other Resident Magistrates, under and in accordance with the provisions of Section 5 of the Act.

The holder may employ any other person to assist him in the conduct of his business without any further licence being required, but the licence may not be transferred to any other person nor may it be altered or tampered with in any way.

Any breach of this Licence is punishable by a penalty not exceeding Five Pounds, and Forty Shillings for every day that the offence continues after conviction.

TRADE BOARDS.

Constitution, Proceedings and Meetings.

REGULATIONS, DATED 14TH AUGUST, 1929, AMENDING THE RESPECTIVE REGULATIONS, SHOWN IN THE SCHEDULE HERETO, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR UNDER SECTION 17 OF THE TRADE BOARDS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923, (13 & 14 GEO. 5, C. 32), WITH RESPECT TO THE CONSTITUTION, PROCEEDINGS AND MEETINGS OF TRADE BOARDS.

1929. No. 81.

The Ministry of Labour (in this Regulation referred to as "the Ministry") in pursuance of powers conferred by the Trade Boards Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, and of every other power the Ministry hereunto enabling hereby varies the respective Regulations specified in the Schedule hereto, governing the constitution, proceedings and meetings of the Trade Boards concerned, to the following extent and in the following way:—

The following Regulation and proviso (a) shall be substituted for Regulation No. 10 and proviso (a) of the respective Regulations specified in the Schedule:—

10. The term of office of a member of the Trade Board shall be for a period of not less than one year nor more than three years, as may be determined by the Ministry, provided that—
