Registration of Institutions.

1932. No. 110.

In pursuance of sub-section (3) of section forty of the Mental Treatment Act (Northern Ireland), 1932 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland hereby makes the following regulations :—

1. The fees payable in respect of each registered institution or house on every application for or every issue or renewal of a certificate of registration under Part III of the Act shall be paid by means of stamps impressed on the form of application or the certificate of registration, as the case may be.

2. The said fees shall be deemed to be stamp duties and be under the management of the said Ministry, and all enactments for the time being in force relating to stamp duties and to dies, plates and other implements provided for the purpose of stamp duties,

including all enactments relating to forgery and frauds relating to stamp duties, shall apply accordingly.

3. These regulations may be cited as the Mental Treatment (Registration of Institutions and Houses) Fees Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1932.

THE MENTAL TREATMENT REGULATIONS, 1932, DATED 23RD DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1932, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER THE MENTAL TREATMENT ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1932 (22 & 23 GEORGE 5, c. 15).

1932. No. 101.

The Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by the Mental Treatment Act (Northern Ireland), 1932, hereby makes the following Regulations :

General.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Mental Treatment Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1932.

2.—(1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say :—

- (a) "The Act" means the Mental Treatment Act (Northern Ireland), 1932;
- (b) "The Ministry" means the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland;
- (c) "Inspector" means an inspector appointed or deemed to have been appointed under the Act;
- (d) "Institution" means any institution or house registered by the Ministry for the care and treatment of persons of unsound mind, and includes, except in sections 48 to 58 (inclusive) of these Regulations, a public mental hospital.
