Transitional Payments.

THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE (TRANSITIONAL PAYMENTS)
(AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1932,
DATED FEBRUARY 12TH, 1932, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF
LABOUR UNDER SECTION 35 OF THE UNEMPLOYMENT
INSURANCE ACT, 1920.

1932. No. 37.

WHEREAS the Ministry of Labour (hereinafter referred to
as "the Ministry") has made the Unemployment Insurance
(Transitional Payments) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1931,
(hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and
it is expedient to amend the said Regulations.

Now therefore the Ministry by virtue of the powers conferred
by Section 35 of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, and of
all other powers in that behalf hereby makes the following
Regulations:—

1. The following Regulations shall be inserted after Regulation
2 (b) of the principal Regulations:—

2.—(c) Subject to the provisions of Article 7 of the Order,
the Committee shall hold office until the Annual Meeting following
the election for the Local Authority by which it was appointed.

(d) The quorum of a Committee appointed under this Regula-
tion shall be not less than three or such larger number as the
Committee may direct.

2. The following Regulation shall be substituted for Regulation 7 of the principal Regulations :—

7.—(a) A determination shall have effect until the expiration of twelve weeks from the beginning of the benefit period next following the date on which the determination is received by the Ministry or until the date as from which a new determination made after review takes effect, whichever period is the shorter.

(b) A new determination made after review shall take effect as from a date to be fixed by the Committee or sub-Committee making the determination, so however that such date shall not be earlier than the commencement of the benefit period in which the said determination is received by the Ministry.

(c) In any case in which transitional payments are being applied for by a person on a date not earlier than ten weeks after the commencement of the benefit period in which a determination in his case was received by the Ministry, the Ministry shall refer such case to the Local Authority for a new determination.

3. The Form of Determination set forth in the Schedule to these Regulations shall be substituted for the Form of Determination set forth in the First Schedule to the principal Regulations.

4. These Regulations may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance Transitional Payments (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1932.

SCHEDULE.

FORM OF DETERMINATION.

Determination.

The circumstances of the above mentioned applicant are such that whilst unemployed he is/ is not in need of assistance by way of transitional payments.

Directions as to amount of Transitional Payments.

A.—*Current Period.*

(1) If applicant is unemployed for a full week (i.e., six days) the amount of transitional payments to be made is:—

- (b) the daily rate (that is, one-sixth of the amounts shown in (1) above) and refer determination back to this Committee for review; or
- (c) the sum of _____ s. _____ d. (This deduction may not be less than one-sixth of the weekly amounts.)

THE WEIGHTS AND MEASURES (AMENDMENT NO. 2) REGULATIONS,
(NORTHERN IRELAND), 1932, DATED 19TH AUGUST, 1932,
MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE UNDER SECTION 5
OF THE WEIGHTS AND MEASURES ACT, 1904, (4 EDW. 7,
C. 28) EXTENDING THE PERIOD OF ALLOWANCE FOR CERTAIN
WEIGHING AND MEASURING APPLIANCES.

The Ministry of Commerce, in exercise of the powers vested in the Ministry in this behalf by Section 5 of the Weights and Measures Act, 1904 (4 Edw. 7, c. 28), and of all other powers in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1.—(a) These Regulations may be cited as the Weights and Measures (Amendment No. 2) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1932.

(b) The Interpretation Act, 1889, (52 & 53 Vict., c. 63) shall apply to these Regulations in like manner as it applies to an Act of Parliament.
