Black Scab in Potatoes.

THE BLACK SCAB IN POTATOES (NORTHERN IRELAND) ORDER
OF 1933, DATED 22ND DAY OF JUNE, 1933.

1933. No. 75.

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland by virtue
and in exercise of the powers vested in it under the Destructive

Insects and Pests, Acts, 1877 and 1907 (40 and 41 Vict., ch. 68, and 7 Edw. 7, ch. 4), and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, orders, and it is hereby ordered as follows :—

I. Short Title.

This Order shall be known as “The Black Scab in Potatoes (Northern Ireland) Order of 1933.”

II. Amendment of the Black Scab in Potatoes (Northern Ireland), Consolidation Order, 1930.

The Black Scab in Potatoes (Northern Ireland) Consolidation Order, 1930, shall be read and have effect as if :

- (a) the following were included in the First Schedule (Scheduled Districts) thereto :—

DISTRICT No. 7. (Bellaghy Area).

A district comprising :—

The townlands of (and all town and villages included therein) Ballydermot (and Intake adjoining), Ballymacombs Beg, Ballymacombs More, Ballymacpeake Lower, Ballymacpeake Upper, Ballynease-Helton, Ballynease Macpeake, Ballynease Strain, Ballyscullion West (and Intake adjoining), Drumanee Lower, Drumanee Upper, Drumlamph, East Glebe, Edenreagh, Glenone, (part south of road from Inishrush to Portglenone via Claudy Bridge and Claudy), Killyberry, Killyberry Boyd, Killyberry Downing, Leitrim (and Intake adjoining), Moneystaghan Ellis, Moneystaghan Macpeake, Mullaghboy (E. D. Bellaghy) Mullaghnamoyagh, Old Town Deer Park, Old Town Downing, Tamlaghtduff, Tamnarian (that portion north of road leading from Castledawson to Bellaghy) and West Glebe; all in the Barony of Loughinsholin, in the Administrative County of Londonderry; that portion (and all towns and villages included therein) of the townland of Brecart in the Barony of Upper Toome in the Administrative County of Antrim, which lies between the old and new courses of the River Bann.

- (b) The following were substituted for Article 7 thereof :—
Restrictions on Movement of Potatoes in and from
Safety Zones.

Potatoes shall not be moved by motor-lorry within, nor by any boat or other vessel or craft from, the districts specified in the Third Schedule to this Order, otherwise than in accordance with the conditions of a licence issued by an Inspector or authorised Officer of the said Ministry authorising such movement.

III. Revocation of Previous Order.

The Black Scab in Potatoes (Northern Ireland) Order of 1932 is hereby revoked as from the first day of July Nineteen Hundred and thirty-three provided that such revocation shall not—

- (i) affect the previous operation of that Order, or any thing duly done or suffered thereunder ; or
- (ii) affect any right, privilege, obligation, or liability acquired, accrued, or incurred thereunder ; or
- (iii) affect any penalty incurred in respect of any offence committed against that Order ; or
- (iv) affect any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any such right, privilege, obligation, liability, or penalty as aforesaid ; and any such investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy may be instituted, continued or enforced, and any such penalty may be imposed, as if this Order had not been made.

IV. Commencement.

This Order shall come into operation on the first day of July 1933.
