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Regulations.

THE DESTRUCTIVE INSECTS AND PESTS NORTHERN IRELAND ORDER OF 1933, DATED 30TH JUNE, 1933.

1933. No. 81.

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in it under the Destructive Insects and Pests Act, 1877 and 1907, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, orders and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

Commencement.

1. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of July, nineteen hundred and thirty-three.

Definitions.

- 2. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires:—
 - "Ministry" means the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland.
 - "Inspector" means an Inspector or other authorised officer of the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland.
 - "Plant" includes tree and shrub and the fruit, seeds, tubers, bulbs, corms, rhizomes, roots, layers, cuttings or other parts of a plant.
 - "Crop" includes plant or any part thereof.
 - "Insect" includes bacteria and other vegetable or animal organisms and any agent causative of a transmissible crop disease.
- "Non-indigenous species" means a species or kind which is destructive to agricultural or horticultural crops or to trees or bushes, and which at the date of the commencement of this Order was not established in Northern Ireland.

Powers of Entry.

3. An Inspector, upon production if so required of his appointment or authority may enter any premises on which he has reason to believe that an insect of a non-indigenous species is kept or that there is any plant attacked by any such insect and may examine such insect and examine and take samples of any plant on such premises.

Adoption of Precautionary Measures.

4.—(1) An Inspector may at any time and from time to time, by notice served on the occupier of premises on which he has reason to believe that there is an insect of a non-indigenous species, require him to adopt such measures for prevention of the spread of the insect as are specified in the notice. Any such

notice may require an occupier to take such steps to destroy any such insect as may be specified therein.

(2) A notice under this Article may prescribe the time within which the adoption of any measure thereby prescribed shall be completed.

Restrictions on keeping certain insects.

5. The keeping, sale or release, in any stage of its existence, of any insect of a non-indigenous species, is hereby prohibited except under and in accordance with the terms of a licence issued by the Ministry.

Service of Notices, etc.

6. For the purpose of this Order a notice shall be deemed to be served on any person if it is delivered to him personally or left for him at his last known place of abode or business or sent through the post in a letter addressed to him there; and a notice purporting to be signed by an Inspector shall be prima facie evidence that it was signed by him.

Information to be given as to Diseased Plants or Parts thereof.

7. Every person who has or has had in his possession or under his charge, any insect of a non-indigenous species or any plant which is attacked by any such insect, and every person who as auctioneer, salesman, or otherwise has sold or offered for sale any such insect or plant shall, if so required in writing by the Ministry or an Inspector, give to the Ministry or Inspector all such information as he possesses as to the persons in whose possession or under whose charge the insect or plant is or has been; provided that any information given under this Article shall not be available as evidence against the person giving the same in any prosecution under this Order, except in respect of an alleged failure to comply with this Article.

Offences.

8. Every person shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, or in respect of a second or subsequent offence to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds, who does any act in contravention of this Order or the terms or conditions of any notice or licence served or issued thereunder, or fails to do any act which he is required to do by this Order or any such notice or licence, or who wilfully obstructs or impedes an Inspector in the exercise of his powers under this Order.

Short Title.

9. This Order may be cited as the Destructive Insects and Pests (Northern Ireland) Order of 1933.
