THE COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCILS (TOWN CLERKS AND DEPUTY TOWN CLERKS QUALIFICATIONS) ORDER, 1935.

1935. No. 110.

To the Council of each County Borough in Northern Ireland; And to all whom it may concern:

The Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") in exercise of the powers vested in it by section eighteen of the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, and of every other power in that behalf enabling the Ministry, hereby prescribes with respect to the appointment of Town Clerks and Deputy Town Clerks of County Boroughs in Northern Ireland as follows, that is to say:—

- 1. No person shall be qualified to be appointed to the office of Town Clerk or Deputy Town Clerk of a County Borough Council in Northern Ireland unless:—
 - (a) (i) he has had wide experience extending over a period of not less than ten years in any one of the following professions:—
 - (a) barrister-at-law;
 - (b) solicitor;
 - (c) chartered accountant;
 - (d) incorporated accountant;

or.

- (ii) he satisfies the Ministry that he has had adequate and suitable experience and has shown capacity in local government administration or in commercial, industrial or financial matters, or in the conduct of public affairs;
- (b) he produces satisfactory evidence to the Ministry that his health and character are good;
- (c) he is a natural born British subject and the son of a father also a natural born British subject, and has

during the whole of the period of five years ending on the date of appointment been resident in the United Kingdom; and

(d) at the time of his appointment by the County Borough Council he is, in the case of an applicant for the position of Town Clerk not more than 45 years of age; and in the case of an applicant for the position of Deputy Town Clerk not more than 35 years of age:

Provided that the Ministry may assent to a departure from the provisions of this paragraph with regard to maximum age limits in the case of a person holding an office under a local authority at the time of his appointment.

- 2. For the purposes of this Order the expression, "local authority" means a county or district council or board of guardians or a regional education committee.
- 3.—(a) The provisions of this Order shall come into operation on the Twenty-fifth day of September, 1935.
- (b) The Ministry may from time to time assent to any departure from the provisions of this Order.
- 4. This Order may be cited as "The County Borough Councils (Town Clerks and Deputy Town Clerks Qualifications) Order, 1935."

THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1934, COUNTY COURT RULES, 1935, DATED THE 29TH DAY OF AUGUST, 1935.

1935. No. 111.

Whereas by an Act, 40 and 41 Vict., c. 45, intituled "The County Officers and Courts (Ireland) Act, 1877," Section 79, it is enacted that the Lord Chancellor, with the concurrence of the County Court Judges and Chairmen of Quarter Sessions in Ireland, or any five of them, to be selected or nominated as in the said Act is provided, may make rules and orders for regulating the proceedings in and practice of the Civil Bills Courts in Ireland and for prescribing the forms of proceedings, and for the several other purposes in the said Act mentioned, and otherwise for earrying the said Act into execution, and may from time to time amend such rules, orders and forms, and that every such rule,
