

EGGS, MARKETING OF.

Rules.

THE MARKETING OF EGGS (AMENDMENT) RULES (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1935, DATED THE 4TH OCTOBER, 1935, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER THE MARKETING OF EGGS ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1924 TO 1931.

1935. No. 117.

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland in exercise of the powers conferred on it by the Marketing of Eggs Acts (Northern Ireland), 1924 to 1931, and of any other power in that behalf enabling it, hereby makes the following Rules, that is to say:—

I. *Short Title.*

These Rules may be cited as the Marketing of Eggs (Amendment) Rules (Northern Ireland), 1935.

II. *Amendment of the Marketing of Eggs Rules (Northern Ireland), 1931.*

Article X of the Marketing of Eggs Rules (Northern Ireland), 1931, (a) is hereby revoked and the following article is substituted therefor:—

- (1) Eggs intended for sale by wholesale by the holder of a Class "A" licence shall be packed according to the following grades:—

Grade Designation. Conditions as to size, etc.

Extra Special : For hen eggs each weighing not less than $2\frac{7}{16}$ ounces.

Special : For hen eggs each weighing not less than $2\frac{3}{16}$ ounces.

Standard : For hen eggs each weighing not less than $1\frac{13}{16}$ ounces.

Selected : For hen eggs each weighing not less than $1\frac{11}{16}$ ounces.

Smalls : For hen eggs each weighing less than $1\frac{11}{16}$ ounces.

Ducks : For duck eggs of reasonably uniform size.

- (2) The top layer of eggs in any case shall be fairly representative of the bulk in size, colour and appearance.
- (3) Subject to the special provisions in the Acts relating to preserved, cold-stored, chemically stored or pickled eggs only "Fresh" or "New Laid" eggs shall be included in any of the prescribed grades.

- (4) Hen eggs and duck eggs shall not be packed in the same case.
- (5) Eggs with weak, cracked, chipped, dented or broken shells shall not be included in any of the prescribed grades.

III. *Consequential Amendments.*

Where throughout the Marketing of Eggs Rules (Northern Ireland), 1931, the terms "Special (18 lb.)," "Special (17 lb.)," "Standard (15½ lb.)," and "Selected (14 lb.)," are used the Rules shall have effect as if there were substituted for the words "Special (18 lb.)," "Special (17 lb.)," "Standard (15½ lb.)," and "Selected (14 lb.)," the words "Extra Special," "Special," "Standard," and "Selected" respectively.

IV. *Commencement.*

These Rules shall come into operation on the first day of January, 1936.

THE ELECTRICITY BOARD FOR NORTHERN IRELAND BORROWING (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 1935, DATED 4TH MARCH, 1935, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE UNDER THE ELECTRICITY (SUPPLY) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1931 (21 & 22 GEO. 5, c. 9).

WHEREAS the Ministry of Commerce for Northern Ireland, with the approval of the Ministry of Finance, in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 27 and 28 of the Electricity (Supply) Act (Northern Ireland), 1931, made Regulations, dated the 14th day of December, 1931, entitled "The Electricity Board for Northern Ireland Borrowing Regulations, 1931."

And whereas it is expedient that Article 8 of the said Regulations should be amended as hereinafter provided.
