THE JOINT MILK COUNCIL (ELECTION OF MEMBERS BY DISTRIBUTORS) REGULATIONS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1935, DATED THE 16TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1935, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER SECTION NINE OF THE MILK AND MILK PRODUCTS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1934 (24 AND 25 GEO. V, CH. 16.).

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section Nine of the Milk and Milk Products Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations, that is to say :—

PART I.*Short Title and Interpretation.*

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Joint Milk Council (Election of Members by Distributors) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1935.

2.—(1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

“The Ministry” means the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland ;

“The Act” means the Milk and Milk Products Act (Northern Ireland), 1934 ;

“The Joint Milk Council” means the Joint Milk Council for Northern Ireland.

Other expressions have the meanings respectively assigned to them in the Act.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889(a), as applied to Northern Ireland by the Interpretation Act, 1921(b), shall apply for the purpose of the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

PART II.

Election of members by holders of Distributors' licences.

3. The Ministry shall, for the purpose of the election of members of the Joint Milk Council by holders of Distributors' licences, prepare and keep a Register of all persons who hold Distributors' licences granted under Section two of the Act.

4. The Register prepared in accordance with the last preceding Article of these Regulations shall be open for inspection at the office of the Ministry from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on such days, other than Saturdays, as the office of the Ministry is open for the transaction of business.

5.—(1) The members of the Joint Milk Council elected by holders of Distributors' licences, shall be elected by the persons registered in pursuance of Article three of these Regulations, and for the purpose of the election to be held in December, 1935, and of any election held on or before the 30th day of October, 1936, in order to fill a casual vacancy, the Ministry shall allot to each such person one unit of voting power, together with an additional unit of voting power for each complete ten thousand gallons of milk of Grade A, Grade B or Grade C (if any) purchased by that person from the holder of a Producer's licence or a Distributor's licence, during the period commencing on the first day of February, 1935, and ending on the thirty-first day of July, 1935, and in connexion with which returns have been duly furnished and any sum payable in respect of Producer's licence fees paid, not later than the thirtieth day of September, 1935.

(2) Any question relating to the number of units of voting power to which a person is entitled shall be determined by the Ministry and such determination shall be final.

(3) A voter may apportion the number of the votes cast by him amongst the candidates for election, provided that he shall not vote for more candidates than there are vacancies to be filled and the aggregate number of votes cast by him shall not exceed the product of the number of vacancies to be filled and the number of units of voting power which has been allotted to him by the Ministry.

PART III.

Biennial Elections.

6.—(1) An election of members of the Joint Milk Council by holders of Distributors' licences shall be held in the year 1935 and in every second calendar year thereafter.

(2) Every election of members by the holders of Distributors' licences held in pursuance of paragraph (1) of this Article shall be held in the month of December, and the last day for the receipt of nominations shall be such day as shall be appointed by the Ministry for the purpose. The other proceedings in connexion with the election shall be taken not later than the times mentioned in the First Schedule to these Regulations.

Elections to fill casual vacancies.

7. In the event of a casual vacancy for a member of the Joint Milk Council elected by the holders of Distributors' licences occurring by death, resignation or otherwise, the vacancy shall be filled in the following manner :—

Not more than ten days after notice in writing of the vacancy shall have been given to the Ministry by the Secretary of the Joint Milk Council, the Ministry shall proceed to hold an election to fill the vacancy and shall appoint a day as the last day for the receipt of nominations. The other proceedings in connexion with the filling of the vacancy shall be taken not later than the times mentioned in the First Schedule to these Regulations.

PART IV.

Arrangements for Elections of members of the Joint Milk Council.

8. The Ministry shall, not later than the last day for the giving of notice of the holding of an election, give public notice that an election is about to be held, and such notice shall include a statement of the day appointed as the last day for the receipt of nominations, the number of vacancies to be filled, and the manner in which nomination papers may be obtained.

9. Each candidate for election shall be nominated in writing, and the nomination paper shall be in the form prescribed in the

Second Schedule to these Regulations, or in a form to the like effect. The nomination paper, which shall be signed by two persons as proposer and seconder, and by at least eight other persons as assenting to the nomination, shall be sent by registered post to the Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture, Stormont, Belfast, so as to arrive not later than the day appointed as the last day for the receipt of nominations. The proposer and the seconder, and the assentors to the nomination of a candidate for election shall be holders of Distributors' licences.

10.—(1) As soon as possible after the day appointed as the last day for the receipt of nominations, the Ministry shall publish the names and addresses of the candidates who have been duly nominated, together with a statement of the last day for the withdrawal of candidates and of the manner in which such withdrawal may be made.

(2) Any candidate may withdraw his candidature by sending by registered post to the Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture, Stormont, Belfast, not later than the day appointed as the last day for the withdrawal of candidates, a notice in writing of such withdrawal signed by him.

11. If the number of candidates who receive valid nominations for election, and who do not withdraw their candidature under Article ten of these Regulations, is, in any case, equal to, or less than, the number of persons to be elected, such candidate or candidates shall be declared to be elected.

12.—(1) If the number of candidates who receive valid nominations for election, and who do not withdraw their candidature under Article ten of these Regulations, exceeds the number of persons to be elected, an election shall be held by post in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations.

(2) Where an election is required to be held under paragraph (1) of this Article, the Ministry shall, not later than the last day for the issue of voting papers, cause a voting paper to be sent to every person entitled to vote at the election, and every voting paper shall contain a statement of the number of votes to which the voter is entitled and of the last day for the receipt of voting papers.

(3) Only such of the said voting papers as are properly completed and as reach the Ministry on or before the last day for the receipt of voting papers, shall be taken into account for the purpose of the election.

(4) The candidate, or where more than one vacancy is to be filled, the candidates, to whom is given the highest number of votes shall be declared elected.

(5) If an equality of votes is found to exist between any candidates, and the addition of a vote would entitle any of such candidates to be declared elected, the Ministry shall, in the

presence of the candidates or of persons (if any) nominated by them for the purpose, determine by lot which of the candidates whose votes are equal shall be elected.

TIMES FOR PROCEEDINGS AT ELECTIONS OF MEMBERS OF THE JOINT MILK COUNCIL BY THE HOLDERS OF DISTRIBUTORS' LICENCES.

| 4. Last day for the receipt of voting papers | Twenty-one clear days after the day appointed as the last day for the receipt of nominations. |

NOTE.—If any of the dates in the above Table falls on a Sunday, a Bank Holiday or other Public Holiday, the reference to it shall be construed as a reference to the following day.
