THE DISPENSARY MEDICAL OFFICERS AND MEDICAL OFFICERS
OF HEALTH IN RURAL DISTRICTS QUALIFICATIONS ORDER,
1935.

1935. No. 142.

To the Guardians of the Poor of each Poor Law Union ;
To the Council of each Rural District in Northern Ireland ;
And to all whom it may concern :

The Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") in exercise of the powers vested in it by section eighteen of the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, and of every other power in that behalf enabling the Ministry, hereby prescribes with respect to the appointment of Medical Officers of Dispensary Districts or Medical Officers of Health in Rural Districts in Northern Ireland as follows, that is to say :—

1. No person shall be qualified to be appointed to the office of Medical Officer of a Dispensary District, or Medical Officer of Health in a Rural District in Northern Ireland unless :—

- (a) he is registered under the Medical Acts ;
- (b) he has obtained a certificate of proficiency in vaccination given by a competent instructor ;
- (c) he produces satisfactory evidence to the Ministry that his health and character are good ;
- (d) he is a natural born British subject and the son of a father also a natural born British subject, and has during the whole of the period of five years ending on the date of appointment been resident in the United Kingdom.

2.—(a) The provisions of this Order shall come into operation on the 26th day of November, 1935.

(b) The Ministry may from time to time assent to any departure from the provisions of this Order.

3. The qualifications contained in this order shall be deemed to be in addition to and not in derogation of any other qualifications required by any other Order or Regulation.

4. This Order may be cited as "The Dispensary Medical Officers and Medical Officers of Health in Rural Districts Qualifications Order, 1935."
