Appointment of Registrars.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE LORDS JUSTICES OF NORTHERN IRELAND UPON THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND AND OF THE MINISTER OF FINANCE FOR NORTHERN IRELAND, IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION 3 (1) AND (3) OF THE COUNTY OFFICERS AND COURTS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1933, AND OF SECTION 13 (1) OF THE COUNTY OFFICERS AND COURTS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1925.

WHEREAS it is provided by section 3 (1) and (3) of the County Officers and Courts Act (Northern Ireland), 1933, that when the

office of County Court Judge in any County ceases to be held by an existing County Court Judge the County Court Service shall include, in addition to the Registrar for Belfast, the Registrar of the County Court, and such Registrar shall be appointed and may be removed under the provisions of the County Officers and Courts Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, in the same manner as any other officer in the County Court Service, and shall be subject to such Regulations as may be made under that Act with respect to Registrars in the County Court Service:

And Whereas it is also provided by the said section that during the continuance in office of the existing County Court Judge of a County, and with the consent of such Judge, a Registrar of the County Court for that County may be appointed under the provisions of the Act of 1925 at any time when the office of Registrar of the said Court becomes vacant, and that a Registrar appointed by such Judge may be appointed as Registrar of the County Court under the provisions of the Act of 1925:

And Whereas it is provided by section 13 (1) of the County Officers and Courts Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, as follows:—

“13.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Act the Governor of Northern Ireland shall have power to make regulations, upon the recommendation of the Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland and of the Minister of Finance for Northern Ireland, for prescribing all or any of the following matters:—

- (a) The duties and hours of attendance of persons employed in the County Court Service;
- (b) The classification and conditions governing the promotion of such persons;
- (c) The conditions for appointment to the County Court Service; and
- (d) Any other matter required to be prescribed for the purpose of giving full effect to this Act.”

Now, therefore, We, the Lords Justices of Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the foregoing section, upon the recommendation of the Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland and of the Minister of Finance for Northern Ireland, hereby make the following Regulations with respect to Registrars appointed—other than the Registrar for Belfast—to the County Court Service:—

1. Every solicitor who shall be appointed as a Registrar after the date of the passing of this Regulation shall be a practising solicitor of at least five years' standing, and shall be resident in and practising in Northern Ireland.

2. All Registrars shall be liable to transfer from one County Court to another, as the Minister of Home Affairs may direct.

3. The remuneration for each post of Registrar or for any person appointed to such post shall be fixed from time to time by the Minister of Home Affairs in conjunction with the Minister of Finance.

4. A Registrar shall discharge such duties as are by law or prescription attached to the office of a Registrar of Civil Bill Courts, and such other duties as may be assigned to him by the County Court Judge.

5. A Registrar—

(a) may at any time retire voluntarily and shall retire on attaining the age of 65; and

(b) may at any time be removed from office by the Governor on the recommendation of the Minister of Home Affairs on grounds of permanent incapacity by reason of bodily or mental infirmity, or on grounds of misconduct or incompetence.

6. The Regulations made on the Twentieth day of December, 1927, setting out the conditions of appointment and service of officers in the County Court Service shall not apply to part-time Registrars.
