Land Purchase Sinking Fund.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE UNDER SUB-SECTION (2) OF SECTION 3 OF THE EXCHEQUER AND FINANCIAL PROVISIONS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923 (13 GEO. 5, CAP. 4).

1935. No. 96.

Whereas it is provided by Section 3 of the Exchequer and Financial Provisions Act (Northern Ireland), 1923 (hereinafter referred to as the Act of 1923) that there shall be charged upon the Consolidated Fund in each financial year such sums as the Ministry of Finance (hereinafter referred to as the Ministry) may certify from time to time to be necessary to be set aside as respects that financial year for the purpose of securing such fixed revenue in perpetuity as may be actuarially ascertained to be equivalent to the varying terminable revenues which accrue to the Exchequer under Section twenty-six of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920:

And whereas it is further provided that any sums so certified shall be issued from the Consolidated Fund to such Account of the Ministry, at such times, and shall be invested, accumulated and applied in such manner, as may be prescribed:

And whereas further provision was made by Section two of the Exchequer and Financial Provisions (No. 2) Act (Northern Ireland), 1933, in respect of the ascertainment of the sum to be set aside for the purposes aforesaid, which purposes are in the said Act referred to as the purposes of the Land Purchase Sinking Fund, the said Fund being hereinafter referred to as the Sinking Fund:

Now, the Ministry in exercise of the foregoing powers hereby prescribes as follows:—

1.—(1) The Ministry may from time to time, and in such manner as it may determine, invest any moneys standing to the credit of the Sinking Fund, and may vary such investments.

(2) The sums issued from time to time to the Sinking Fund out of the Consolidated Fund in accordance with the Act of 1923 as amended, and all interest, dividends and other moneys received by the Ministry in respect of the Sinking Fund and the proceeds of the realisation of all investments of the Sinking Fund shall be paid into, and all issues from the Sinking Fund shall be made out of, a separate account at the Exchequer Bank, entitled "Land Purchase Sinking Fund Account."

(3) The said Account shall be operated on by the same officers as operate on the Revenue and other accounts of the Ministry,

and in the same manner.

2. These Regulations may be cited as the Land Purchase Sinking Fund Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1935.
