

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this scheme the Ministry may, in the case of any teacher who retires between the 1st day of July, 1936, and the 30th day of June, 1941, admit for the purpose of calculating the additional allowance periods of less than a completed year of service but not less than a complete calendar month.

6. This scheme may be cited as the Teachers (Public Elementary) Superannuation (Amendment) Scheme, 1936.

(AMENDMENT) SCHEME, 1935.

WHEREAS a Scheme (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Scheme") dated the 6th day of June, 1929, was framed by the Ministry of Finance, in consultation with the Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Agriculture, in pursuance of Section 70 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1923 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1923"), as amended by Section 8 of the Teachers' Superannuation Act (Northern Ireland), 1926 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1926"), for giving effect to arrangements made with the Board of Education and the Scottish Education Department relating to the superannuation of teachers, and the Principal Scheme was approved by Order in Council on the 16th day of August, 1929 :

And whereas it has been deemed desirable to amend the Principal Scheme in certain particulars :

And whereas the Ministry of Finance, in consultation with the Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Agriculture, has, in pursuance of Section 70 of the Act of 1923, as amended by Section 8 of the Act of 1926, framed a Scheme (hereinafter referred to as "the Amending Scheme") for amending the Principal Scheme, which Amending Scheme is set out in the Schedule to this Order :..

And whereas the Amending Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament, and neither such House has within the period prescribed in that behalf by Section 71 of the Act of 1923, as amended by Section 4 of the Rules Publication Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, presented an Address praying the Governor of Northern Ireland to withhold his assent from the Amending Scheme :

Now we, the Lords Justices for the government of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, in pursuance and by virtue of the enactments hereinbefore mentioned and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do hereby approve of the Amending Scheme.

#### SCHEDULE.

---

In pursuance of Section 70 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, as amended by Section 8 of the Teachers' Superannuation Act (Northern Ireland), 1926, the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland, after consultation with the Ministries of Education and Agriculture for Northern Ireland, hereby frames the following Superannuation Scheme for amending the Teachers' Superannuation (Reciprocal Arrangements) Scheme, 1929, hereinafter called the Principal Scheme :—

1. This Scheme shall have effect as if it had always formed part of the Principal Scheme.

2. The following shall be added to the definition of " approved external service " contained in Article 2 of the Principal Scheme :

" save where the teacher claims that no part of such service shall be treated as approved external service for the purpose of this Scheme."

3. The following shall be substituted for modification (4) contained in Article 3 of the Principal Scheme :—

" The pension or gratuity payable from the fund shall be calculated by reference to the actual period of Northern Ireland approved service and not by reference to the number of completed years of that service in any case where the Northern Ireland approved service and the approved external service (the sum of which is hereinafter in this

Scheme referred to as total service) include fractions of a year which, when added together, amount to or exceed twelve months, provided that, where such fractions, when added together, exceed twelve months, there shall be deducted from the Northern Ireland approved service a proportion of the excess equal to the proportion which the Northern Ireland approved service bears to the total service."

4. The following shall be added to modification (5) contained in Article 3 of the Principal Scheme :—

"provided that where the reduction (if any) made from his approved external service by the appropriate pension authority or authorities in Great Britain is, when added to the reduction calculated as aforesaid, less than the excess, the reduction to be made from the Northern Ireland approved service shall be such as will be sufficient when added to the reduction (if any) from the approved external service, to make up the excess."

5. In paragraph (2) of Article 6 of the Principal Scheme, the following shall be substituted for "service as a teacher in Great Britain" where that expression occurs for the second time in the paragraph :—

"approved external service."

6. This Scheme may be cited as the Teachers' Superannuation (Reciprocal Arrangements) (Amendment) Scheme, 1935.

WHEREAS a Scheme (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Scheme") dated the 11th day of March, 1925, was framed by the Ministry of Finance in consultation with the Ministry of
