

### III. *Shipment of Apples below "C" Standard.*

Notwithstanding any provision of the Marketing of Fruit Rules (Northern Ireland), 1933, as amended by the Marketing of Fruit Rules (Northern Ireland), 1935, and the Marketing of Fruit Rules (Northern Ireland) (No. 2) of 1935, apples which fail to reach the requirements for Standard "C" as specified in the Third Schedule to the Marketing of Fruit Rules (Northern Ireland), 1933, may be shipped for the fresh fruit market to Great Britain and the Isle of Man subject to the following conditions:—

- (1) Consignments shall be packed in one of the under-mentioned containers:—
  - (a) Standard orange box or case;
  - (b) „ lemon „ „
  - (c) „ onion „ „
- (2) Each container shall—
  - (a) contain not more than 10 per cent. by count of fruit equal to or above the requirements for Standard "C" as referred to above;
  - (b) be clearly and indelibly stencilled on the outside of the container with the words "CULLS" in letters not less than one inch high and shall be similarly stencilled with the number of the sender's licence or permit.

### IV. *Commencement.*

These Rules shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of September, 1937.

### Rate of Payment to Ministry of Commerce.

ORDER OF THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE FOR NORTHERN IRELAND, DATED JANUARY 1ST, 1937, UNDER SECTION 7 OF THE GAS REGULATION ACT, 1920, AS AMENDED BY SECTION 2 OF THE ELECTRICITY AND GAS (EXPENSES) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923, PRESCRIBING THE RATE OF PAYMENT TO THE SAID MINISTRY FOR THE YEAR 1937.

NOTE:—By this Order the Ministry of Commerce fixed the rate of payment to the said Ministry for the year 1937 at ten pence for each million cubic feet of gas sold during the year 1936.
