Sale of Ice-Cream Act, 1937: Publication of Provisions.

REGULATIONS, DATED 27TH MAY, 1938, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER SECTION 6 (8) OF THE SALE OF ICE-CREAM ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1937.

1938. No. 66.

The Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland in pursuance of the powers vested in it by Sub-section (8) of Section 6 of the Sale of Ice-cream Act (Northern Ireland) hereby directs that notice of the provisions of the said section shall be published by the sanitary authority in two successive weeks in two newspapers circulating in the district and also by posters at suitable places.

The notice shall set out that under the Section:

- (1) Any person who makes or keeps ice-cream in a place where it is liable to be contaminated or omits to take adequate precautions against its contamination or fails to notify the medical officer of health of the occurrence of any infectious disease on the premises where the ice-cream is kept or made is liable to a penalty not exceeding Five Pounds for a first offence and of Fifty Pounds for any subsequent offence:
- (2) Every vehicle or stand from which ice-cream is sold must have the vendor's name and address legibly painted or inscribed on the vehicle or stand, and failure to comply renders the vendor liable to a fine not exceeding Five Pounds:
- (3) Ice-cream produced or sold in conditions likely to be injurious to health or which is unfit for human consumption may be seized and destroyed:
- (4) Persons obstructing the officers of the sanitary authority in the execution of their duty are liable to a fine not exceeding Five Pounds.
