

(6) If an insured contributor to whom these Regulations apply is outside the United Kingdom at the time of his engagement by an employer having his principal place of business in Northern Ireland, it shall be the duty of such employer, without prejudice to the provisions of any other Regulations, to obtain a fresh book in respect of the insured contributor from a local office.

REGULATIONS, DATED 21ST DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1939, MADE BY THE
MINISTRY OF LABOUR FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER THE
UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1936
AND 1938.

1939. No. 155.

The Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the powers conferred on it by paragraph 3 of Part I of the First Schedule to the Unemployment Insurance Act (Northern Ireland), 1936, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1.—These Regulations may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Employment under Local and Public Authorities) Amendment Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1939, and shall be read as one with the Unemployment Insurance (Employment under Local and Public Authorities) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1937 (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Regulations”), and these Regulations and the principal Regulations may be cited together as the Unemployment Insurance (Employment under Local and Public Authorities) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1937 and 1939.

2.—The following sub-paragraph shall be inserted after sub-paragraph (j) in the Schedule to the principal Regulations:—

“(k) In the cooking or preparation of meals provided for school children in pursuance of the Education Acts (Northern Ireland), 1923 to 1939, where the work is performed in the home of the person so employed.”

Insurance Industry: Special Scheme.

REGULATIONS, DATED 18TH SEPTEMBER, 1939, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR UNDER THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1936.

1939. No. 137.

The Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland, by virtue of the powers conferred on it by sections 77 and 111 of the Unemployment Insurance Act (Northern Ireland), 1936, and of all other powers in that behalf, with the approval of the Ministry of Finance, hereby makes the following Regulations :—

Short title and
commence-
ment

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Special Scheme) (Transfer) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1939, and shall come into force on the date hereof.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1921, applies to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Interpretation

2.—(1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say :—

“ *The Act* ” means the Unemployment Insurance Act (Northern Ireland), 1936, as amended by any subsequent order or enactment;

“ *Benefit* ” means benefit (other than agricultural benefit) under the State Scheme or benefit under the Insurance Industry Scheme, as the case may be;

“ *Benefit scheme* ” means the scheme under which a person is entitled to have his claim for benefit determined;

“ *Benefit year* ” means benefit year under the State Scheme or claim year under the Insurance Industry Scheme, as the case may be;

“ *The State Scheme* ” means the general provisions of the Act;

“ *The Insurance Industry Scheme* ” means the special scheme approved, varied and amended by the Unemployment
