POTATOES

- (1) The pressure shall not exceed sixteen volts.
- (2) The circuit shall be heavily insulated and shall be independent of the chassis.
- (3) The wiring shall be so fixed and protected as to reduce as far as possible risk of damage.
- (4) The battery shall be in an easily accessible position.
- (5) Means of cutting-off the current close to the battery by a double pole switch or other suitable method shall be provided in an easily accessible position.
- (6) If the vehicle is required to be fitted with a fire-resisting shield, the generator, battery, switches and fuses shall be carried in front of the shield.

Note.—Section 6 (2) of the Petroleum (Consolidation) Act (Northern Ireland), 1929, provides that:—

"If any person contravenes or attempts to contravene any Regulation made under this section, he shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding twenty pounds for every day on which the offence occurs or continues, and the Court before whom any person is convicted under this sub-section may order that the petroleum-spirit in respect of which the offence was committed and any vessel in which it is contained be forfeited or otherwise dealt with in such manner as the Court thinks fit."

Short Title.

1.—This Order may be cited as the Black Scab in Potatoes (Northern Ireland) Order of 1940.

Amendment of the Black Scab in Potatoes (Northern Ireland) Consolidation Order, 1930.

2.—The Black Scab in Potatoes (Northern Ireland) Consolidation Order, 1930, shall be read and have effect as if the following were included in the Sixth Schedule (Additional Districts in which the growing and planting of potatoes are restricted) thereto:

Importation from Eire

District No. 6 (Ballyclare Safety Zone):

A district comprising the townlands of Ballyclare and Ballygallagh in the baronies of Antrim Upper and Belfast Lower in the Administrative County of Antrim.

Commencement.

3.—This Order shall come into operation on the fifth day of November, 1940.

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in it under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts (Northern Ireland), 1877 to 1934, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, orders and it is hereby ordered as follows :---

Short Title,

1.—This Order may be cited as the Importation of Potatoes (Northern Ireland) Order of 1940.

Definitions.

2.—In this Order—

"The Ministry" means the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland.

"Importer" includes any person, who, whether as owner, consignor or consignee, agent, broker, or carrier, is in possession of, or in anywise entitled to the custody or control of the potatoes.

"Inspector "means an Inspector or other authorised officer of the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland.

Restriction on the Importation of Potatoes from Eire.

3.—With a view to preventing the spread in Northern Ireland of the disease known as Black Scab (Synchitrium endobioticum Perc.) :—
