Now, Therefore, I, the Right Honourable Sir Richard Dawson Bates, Bart., D.L., M.P., Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, by this Regulation do make further provision for the preservation of the Peace and Maintenance of Order, and the said Regulation now made, and the Regulations contained in the said Schedule shall have effect and be construed as if the said Regulation now made formed part of the said Regulations in the said Schedule, that is to say:—

23B (1) For the purposes of Regulation 23B the expression "a Chief Officer of Police or a Police Officer of higher rank" means the Inspector General or the Deputy Inspector General.

## Persons Entering Northern Ireland.

1940. No. 54.

Whereas certain Regulations for Peace and Order in Northern Ireland are contained in the Schedule to the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Act (Northern Ireland), 1922, and it is provided by subsection (3) of Section 1 of the said Act that the Minister of Home Affairs shall have power to make Regulations (a) for making further provision for the preservation of the Peace and Maintenance of Order, and (b) for varying or revoking any provision of the Regulations, whether contained in the said Schedule, or made as aforesaid, and that any Regulations made as aforesaid shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, have effect and be enforced in like manner as Regulations contained in the said Schedule:

Now, THEREFORE, I, The Right Honourable Sir Richard Dawson Bates, Bart., D.L., M.P., Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, do make the following Regulation for making further provision for the preservation of the Peace and Maintenance of Order, and the said Regulation shall be enforced and have effect in like manner as Regulations contained in the said Schedule, and the said Regulation now made, and the Regulations contained in the said Schedule shall have effect and be construed as if the said Regulation now made formed part of said Regulations in said Schedule, that is to say:—

1A.—(2) On and after the 1st July, 1940, a person who shall have entered Northern Ireland from any place other than another part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland shall, if so required by any Constable, satisfy the Police Authorities that his presence in Northern Ireland is essential for the purpose of transacting legitimate business of importance to the national interests of the United Kingdom.

Failure to comply with this Requirement shall be an offence under the Regulations.
