

2.—The services of any person employed as aforesaid may be dispensed with—

- (i) in a case where the person has given notice of his desire that his services should be dispensed with, by the Inspector General of the Royal Ulster Constabulary :
- (ii) in any other case, in accordance with the provisions of section 2 of the Constabulary Act (Northern Ireland), 1922.

3.—Paragraph (1A) of Regulation 29B of the said Regulations (which paragraph relates to disobedience to lawful orders and absence from duty) shall apply to any person employed as aforesaid.

4.—This Order may be cited as the Police (Employment and Offences) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1941.

ORDER, DATED 4TH JULY, 1941, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF PUBLIC SECURITY FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER REGULATION 29B OF THE DEFENCE (GENERAL) REGULATIONS, 1939.

1941. No. 131.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on it by Regulation 29B of the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939, the Ministry of Public Security for Northern Ireland hereby orders as follows :—

1.—Subject as hereinafter provided, any person who, on or after the date of this Order, is employed as a member of the Royal Ulster Constabulary, shall continue in such employment until his services are dispensed with in accordance with the provisions of Article 2 of this Order.

2.—The services of any person employed as aforesaid may be dispensed with—

- (i) in a case where the person has given notice of his desire that his services should be dispensed with, by the Inspector General of the Royal Ulster Constabulary ;
- (ii) in any other case, in accordance with the provisions of section 2 of the Constabulary Act (Northern Ireland), 1922.

3.—Paragraph (1A) of Regulation 29B of the said Regulations (which paragraph relates to disobedience to lawful orders and absence from duty) shall apply to any person employed as aforesaid.

4.—The Police (Employment and Offences) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1941, is hereby revoked:

POTATOES.

Lifting of : Prohibition.

REGULATIONS, DATED 30TH JUNE, 1941, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE UNDER REGULATION 62 OF THE DEFENCE (GENERAL) REGULATIONS, 1939, AND THE CULTIVATION OF LANDS (NORTHERN IRELAND) ORDER, 1939.

1941. No. 127.

In pursuance of Regulation 62 of the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939 (a), and the Cultivation of Lands (Northern Ireland) Order, 1939 (b), the Minister of Agriculture for Northern Ireland hereby makes the following Order :—

1.—No person shall lift potatoes of the varieties mentioned in the first column of the Schedule to this Order before the dates respectively set opposite thereto in the second column of the Schedule except under and in accordance with the terms of a licence issued by the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland.

2.—A licence issued by the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland under this Order shall specify

- (i) the variety of potatoes to which it relates,
- (ii) the land on which the potatoes to which it relates are growing,
- (iii) the date on or after which it shall be lawful to lift the potatoes.

3.—In this Order "potatoes" means potatoes grown in Northern Ireland for the purpose of sale.

4.—This Order may be cited as the Lifting of Potatoes (Prohibition) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1941.
