

10.—In this Order “fertiliser” means any article named in the first column of Part I of the First Schedule to The Fertilisers and Feeding Stuffs Act 1926.

“Produce” includes the mixing together of two or more fertilisers whether or not those fertilisers or any of them have been produced by the person mixing them.

“Distribute wholesale” means supply to any person whose business includes the selling of fertilisers, and the expressions “acquire” and “dispose of” include respectively the giving and taking of possession.

“Distribute retail” means supply any fertiliser to any person buying for a purpose other than resale.

This Order may be cited as The Control of Fertilisers (Northern Ireland) (No. 1) Order, 1941.

This Order shall come into force on the 2nd day of September, 1941.

ORDER, DATED OCTOBER 25TH, 1941, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER REGULATION 55 (1) OF THE DEFENCE (GENERAL) REGULATIONS, 1939.

WHEREAS by the Delegation of the Control of Fertilisers in Northern Ireland (Supply) (No. 1) Order, 1941, (a) the Minister of Supply delegated, subject to the provisions of that Order, his powers as respects Northern Ireland under paragraph (1) of Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939, (b) to the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as “the Ministry”) for the purpose of the control of fertilisers :

AND WHEREAS it appears to the Ministry to be necessary for maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community and expedient that this Order should be made :

(a) S. R. & O. (U.K.) 1941, No. 1110.

(b) S. R. & O. (U.K.) 1939, No. 927.

Now, THEREFORE, the Ministry in pursuance of the powers so delegated to it and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders as follows :—

1.—Notwithstanding anything in the Control of Fertilisers (Northern Ireland) (No. 1) Order, 1941, (c) (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Order”), and subject to the provisions of the next following article :—

(1) No person shall, except in accordance with the terms of a licence issued by or on behalf of the Ministry—

- (a) produce ; or
 - (b) dispose, or agree to offer to dispose, of ; or
 - (c) acquire, or agree or offer to acquire ;
- any fertiliser containing any imported potassium salts ;

(2) No ultimate buyer shall, except in accordance with the terms of a licence issued by or on behalf of the Ministry—

- (a) acquire, or agree or offer to acquire, any fertiliser containing any imported potassium salts except from a person who has been licensed by or on behalf of the Ministry to dispose of such fertiliser to him ; or
- (b) use any fertiliser containing imported potassium salts for a purpose other than that specified in his application for permission to acquire such fertiliser.

2.—(1) The provision of Article 1 of this Order shall not apply to the distribution by wholesale of General Purposes Garden Fertiliser (Ministry of Agriculture Formula) or Tomato Manure (Ministry of Agriculture Formula) ;

(2) The provisions of the said Article 1 shall not apply to the distribution by retail of General Purposes Garden Fertiliser (Ministry of Agriculture Formula) or Tomato Manure (Ministry of Agriculture Formula) disposed of or acquired for the purpose of application to land situate in Northern Ireland if the quantity so disposed of (whether in one or more lots) to an ultimate buyer does not, while this Order remains in force, exceed :—

- (a) in the case of the first-mentioned fertiliser, two hundred-weight ;
- (b) in the case of the second-mentioned fertiliser, four stone.

3.—The principal Order shall be amended :—

- (a) by deleting in Article 2 thereof the words “ or agree or offer to acquire ” and the words “ or from ” ;

- (b) by inserting after sub-paragraph (b) of Article 2 thereof the following sub-paragraph—“(c) to another wholesaler who has nominated him as his supplier”;
- (c) by inserting after Article 7 thereof the words “provided that in the case of a distribution by retail involving a quantity of not more than one hundredweight of any fertiliser the requirements of this Article shall be deemed to have been complied with if a record is kept of the total quantities so disposed of.”

4.—In this Order the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say :—

“General Purposes Garden Fertiliser (Ministry of Agriculture Formula)” and “Tomato Manure (Ministry of Agriculture Formula)” mean any fertiliser so designated under the authority of the Ministry.

“Ultimate buyer” means a person authorised by or on behalf of the Ministry to acquire any fertiliser containing any imported potassium salts otherwise than for the purpose of resale.

5.—(1) This Order may be cited as The Control of Fertilisers (Northern Ireland) (No. 2) Order, 1941;

(2) This Order shall be construed as one with the principal Order;

(3) This Order shall come into force on the 25th day of October, 1941.

THE LOCATION OF INDUSTRY (RESTRICTION) (NORTHERN IRELAND) ORDER, 1941, DATED 26TH JULY, 1941, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE UNDER REGULATION 55A OF THE DEFENCE (GENERAL) REGULATIONS, 1939.

WHEREAS the Board of Trade are a competent authority under the provisions of Regulation 55A of the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939.
