Duties : Exemption Tribunals.

THE CIVIL DEFENCE DUTIES (EXEMPTION TRIBUNALS) (NORTHERN IRELAND) (AMENDMENT) ORDER, 1942, DATED 3RD DECEMBER, 1942, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF PUBLIC SECURITY UNDER REGULATIONS 26A AND 27A OF THE DEFENCE (GENERAL) REGULATIONS, 1939.

WHEREAS by the Delegation of Emergency Powers (Ministry of Public Security for Northern Ireland) Order, 1942 (a), made on 26th March, 1942, by the Secretary of State under Regulation 102A (1) of the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939 (b), the Secretary of State delegated his powers as respects Northern Ireland under Regulations 26A and 27A of the said Regulations to the Ministry of Public Security for Northern Ireland :

NOW, THEREFORE, the Ministry of Public Security for Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the powers so delegated to it and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders as follows :—

1. In paragraph (1) of Article 2 and in Article 4 of the Civil Defence Duties (Exemption Tribunals) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1941 (c) (hereinafter referred to as "the principal order") for the words "paragraph 3 (d) of Article 3 of the Fire Prevention (Business Premises) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1941," there shall be substituted the words "paragraph (a) or (aa) of the proviso to paragraph (1) of Article 4 of the Fire Prevention (Business Premises) (Northern Ireland) (No. 2)

Order, 1941 (d), or under paragraph (a) or (b) of the proviso to paragraph (1) of Article 4 of the Fire Prevention (Government Premises) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1942 (e) ”.

2. After Article 6 of the principal order there shall be inserted the following new Article :—

“ 6A. Any reference in this order to any Regulation or order shall be construed as a reference to that Regulation or that order as amended by any subsequent Regulation or order.”

3.—(1) For paragraph (4) of the First Schedule to the principal order there shall be substituted the following paragraph :—

“ (4) In cases before the Court the applicant or appellant as the case may be may appear in person or be represented by

(a) a representative of a trade union of which he is a member ;

or

(b) a representative of an organisation of which he is a member being an organisation holding a certificate of approval under the Civil Service (Approved Association) Regulations, 1927 (f), or the Civil Service (Approved Associations) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1928 (g) ; or

(c) any person who satisfies the Court that he is a relative or personal friend of the party he proposes to represent. No party may be represented by counsel or solicitor ”.

(2) For sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph (5) of the said First Schedule there shall be substituted the following sub-paragraph :—

“ (a) Subject to the provisions of this Schedule there shall be entitled to be heard before the Court on any application or appeal made in accordance with this order :—

(i) any person authorised in that behalf by the local authority concerned in the application or appeal ; or

(ii) the occupier of the premises at which the applicant is required to perform the duties with respect to which the application is made, or any person authorised by him in that behalf or, in the case of premises occupied by or for the purposes of a government department, any person authorised in that behalf by the appropriate department for the premises.”

4. For Part III of the Second Schedule to the principal order there shall be substituted the contents of the Schedule to this order.

5.—(1) This order may be cited as the Civil Defence Duties (Exemption Tribunals) (Northern Ireland) (Amendment) Order, 1942, and the principal order and this order may be cited together as the Civil Defence Duties (Exemption Tribunals) (Northern Ireland) Orders, 1941 and 1942.

(2) This order shall come into operation on the date hereof but shall be deemed to have had effect—

- (a) in relation to applications made under paragraph (a) or (b) of the proviso to paragraph (1) of Article 4 of the Fire Prevention (Government Premises) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1942, from the seventh day of September, nineteen hundred and forty-two ;
- (b) in relation to applications made under paragraph (a) or (aa) of the proviso to paragraph (1) of Article 4 of the Fire Prevention (Business Premises) (Northern Ireland) (No. 2) Order, 1941, as amended by the Fire Prevention (Business Premises) (Northern Ireland) (Amendment) Order, 1942 (a), from the fifth day of October, nineteen hundred and forty-two.
