

(b) by notice in writing require the cleansing, treatment or destruction of any article specified in the notice which is, or is likely to be, verminous by reason of having been used by, or in contact with that person.

(4) Where any requirement made under this order relates to a child, the parent or guardian or other person for the time being having charge of the child shall do all such things as are necessary for the purpose of securing or facilitating the fulfilment of the requirement, and shall comply with any reasonable request or instructions given for that purpose by or on behalf of the medical superintendent officer of health.

(5) The medical superintendent officer of health or other person by whom premises are inspected in pursuance of this order may require the occupier of the premises to furnish particulars of all persons who are or have recently been accommodated on the premises.

(6) The cleansing of a female under this order shall be carried out only by a registered medical practitioner, or by a woman duly authorised by the medical superintendent officer of health.

3. This Order may be cited as the Scabies (No. 2) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1942, and shall come into force on the date hereof.

Registration.

THE SPECIFIED CLASSES OF PERSONS (REGISTRATION) (NO. 3) (NORTHERN IRELAND) ORDER, 1942, DATED 15TH JUNE, 1942, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER REGULATION 58A OF THE DEFENCE (GENERAL) REGULATIONS, 1939.

The Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry"), by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by Regulation 58A of the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939, hereby makes the following Order:—

1.—This Order may be cited as the Specified Classes of Persons (Registration) (No. 3) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1942, and shall come into force on the 29th day of June, 1942.

2.—Every person to whom this Order applies shall register particulars about himself in the form set out in the First Schedule hereto or in such other form approved by the Ministry substantially to the like effect.

3.—(1) Every person to whom this Order applies—

(a) shall make application either in writing to the Ministry of Labour, 110, Eglantine Avenue, Belfast, or in person or writing to any Employment Exchange, not later than the 11th day of July, 1942, for a form for the purpose of the registration aforesaid; and

(b) shall complete the form sent to him and deliver it to the nearest Employment Exchange of the Ministry within five days of its receipt by him. For this purpose the form shall be deemed to have been received by such person on the third day after its dispatch to him, and to have been duly delivered by him if it is posted on the last of the five days.

(2) If at any time while a person is registered under the provisions of this Order a change occurs in his name or address or in the place where he is employed or carries on his occupation he shall forthwith notify the change to the nearest Employment Exchange of the Ministry.

4.—(1) This Order applies to the class of persons described in the Second Schedule hereto.

(2) This Order applies to any member of the Local Defence Volunteer Section of the Ulster Special Constabulary who is in the said class, but does not apply to any person while he is actually serving with the Royal Ulster Constabulary or the armed forces of the Crown.
