WHEREAS certain Regulations for Peace and Order in Northern Ireland are contained in the Schedule to the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Act (Northern Ireland), 1922, and it is provided by sub-section (3) of Section 1 of the said Act that the Minister of Home Affairs shall have power to make Regulations (a) for making further provision for the preservation of the Peace and maintenance of Order, and (b) for varying or revoking any provision of the Regulations, whether contained in the said Schedule, or made as aforesaid, and that any Regulations made as aforesaid shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, have effect and be enforced in like manner as Regulations contained in the said Schedule :

NOW, THEREFORE, I, THE RIGHT HONOURABLE WILLIAM LOWRY, K.C., M.P., Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, by this Regulation do make further provision for the preservation of Peace and Maintenance of Order, and do hereby as from the date hereof revoke Regulation 26 contained in the said Schedule and order that the following Regulation shall be substituted therefor :—

- 26 (1) If it appears to the Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland that the publication or continued publication of any newspaper, periodical, book, circular or other printed matter is prejudicial to or likely to be prejudicial to the preservation of the peace and the maintenance of order in Northern Ireland the Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland may by order prohibit for any specified period the publication of any such newspaper, periodical, book, circular or other printed matter.
- (2) If any person shall, within such specified period, print, publish, circulate or distribute or be in any way concerned in the printing, publication, circulation or distribution of any newspaper, periodical, book, circular or other printed matter the publication of which has been prohibited under this regulation he shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.
