ORDER, DATED 1ST OCTOBER, 1945, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER THE CONSTABULARY AND POLICE (IRELAND) ACT, 1919, AS APPLIED BY THE CONSTABULARY ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1922.

I, The Right Honourable EDMOND WARNOCK, K.C., Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by Section 2 of the Constabulary Act (Northern Ireland), 1922, and by Section 4 of the Constabulary and Police (Ireland) Act, 1919, as applied by the said Act of 1922, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do hereby order as follows :—

1. For Articles 1, 2 and 3 respectively of the Schedule to the Royal Ulster Constabulary (Women Members) Pay Order, 1944, there shall be substituted Articles 1, 2 and 3 of the Schedule appended hereto, and after Article 5 of the Schedule to the said Royal Ulster Constabulary (Women Members) Pay Order, 1944, there shall be added Article 4 of the Schedule appended hereto.

2. The Royal Ulster Constabulary (Women Members) Pay (Amending) (No. 1) Order, 1945, and the Royal Ulster Constabulary (Women Members) Pay (Amending) (No. 2) Order, 1945, shall be revoked.

3. This Order shall have effect as from the 1st April, 1945.

And I certify that Sub-section (2) of Section 4 of the Constabulary and Police (Ireland) Act, 1919, which provides that a draft of any Order proposed to be made under the said Section shall be submitted to the representative body or bodies constituted by the Act and representing any rank or ranks affected, and that before making the Order the Ministry of Home Affairs shall consider any representations made by such body or bodies, has been fully observed.

This Order shall apply only to women members of the Royal Ulster Constabulary and may be cited as the Royal Ulster Constabulary (Women Members) Pay (Amending) (No. 3) Order, 1945, and shall be construed as one with the Royal Ulster Constabulary (Women Members) Pay Orders, 1944 and 1945, and those Orders and this Order may be cited together as the Royal Ulster Constabulary (Women Members) Pay Orders, 1944 and 1945.

(b) In determining the point at which a member of the Force who was serving in the rank of Constable on or before the 31st March, 1945, shall enter the scale prescribed in paragraph (a) of this Article, credit shall be given to her for past service in that rank by reckoning it for the purpose of increments."

2. "2. *Sergeants*

(b) In determining the point at which a member of the Force who was serving in the rank of Sergeant on or before the 31st March, 1945, shall enter the scale prescribed in paragraph (a) of this Article, credit shall be given to her for past service in that rank by reckoning it for the purpose of increments."

3. "3. The scale for Constables prescribed in the foregoing Article 1 shall be subject to the following conditions :—

(a) On appointment the Constable shall be on probation for a period of two years ;

(b) During the period of probation, the services of any Constable may be dispensed with, should they prove unsatisfactory ;

(c) A Constable who has served for at least seven years at the maximum of the ordinary scale of pay (102/- weekly) shall be eligible, at the discretion of the Inspector General, for the grant of an additional increment of 3/- per week and after a further period of at least five years from the date of the grant of such additional increment shall be eligible for the grant of a second additional increment of 3/- per week, provided that in each case the Inspector General is satisfied that she has been zealous and efficient in the discharge of her duties. Any such additional increments shall be reckoned as part of the Constable's pay for pension purposes ;

(d) A Constable with not less than five years' service shall be eligible for the grant of a special advance of one increment in the scale if her conduct has been good, her service has been marked by special zeal, general intelligence and proficiency, and

she passes a qualifying examination in educational subjects and police work of the standard required for promotion. A second special advance of one increment may be granted after she has served for at least one year from the date of the grant of the first special advance of one increment if the Inspector General is satisfied that her conduct continues to be good and that she continues to show special zeal, general intelligence and proficiency in the performance of her duties;

(e) The retention of an additional increment or special increment or increments granted under paragraphs (c) or (d) of this Article shall be subject to continued good conduct and efficiency in the performance of duty and if this condition is not satisfied the increment or increments shall be withdrawn."

4. "6. Where a Constable who, at any time after completing her period of probation has resigned from the Royal Ulster Constabulary, subsequently rejoins the Force, the Inspector General may, if he thinks fit, allow the years which, at the date of her resignation, had been credited to her for the purposes of pay in the Force to be, in whole or in part, similarly credited to her for the purposes of pay on her rejoining the Force."

SALE OF ICE CREAM.

REGULATION, DATED FIFTH DAY OF JUNE, 1945, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER SECTION TEN OF THE SALE OF ICE CREAM ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1937.

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland in the exercise of the powers conferred on it by section ten of the Sale of Ice Cream Act (Northern Ireland), 1937, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf hereby makes the following Regulations that is to say:—

For the purposes of paragraph (b) of sub-section (1) of section three of the Act, ice cream shall comply with the following bacteriological standards:—

When measured in liquid form ice cream shall contain—

- (a) not more than 200,000 bacteria per millilitre, and
- (b) no coliform organisms in one millilitre.
