Ryegrass (Control of Harvesting).

Provided that any licence granted or having effect under any of these Orders and subsisting immediately before the coming into force of this Order, shall continue to have effect as though granted under this Order.

- 15.--(1) This Order may be cited as The Control of Fertilisers (Northern Ireland) Order, 1946.
 - (2) This Order shall come into force on the 1st day of December, 1946.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport)

This Order revokes The Control of Fertilisers (Northern Ireland) (No. 1) Order, 1941, The Control of Fertilisers (Northern Ireland) (No. 3) Order, 1942, and The Control of Fertilisers (Northern Ireland) Order, 1944, but re-enacts certain provisions of these Orders. The Order in effect abolishes the rationing of fertilisers to farmers and fertilisers may be purchased by licensed merchants and farmers without making application to the Ministry or obtaining a permit. The Order also includes an additional provision permitting the sale of pre-packed fertilisers in quantities not exceeding twenty-eight pounds.

EMERGENCY AND TRANSITIONAL POWERS.

In this Order the following expression has the meaning hereby 1. assigned to it, that is to say,

> " ryegrass " means a crop produced by sowing seed of perennial ryegrass or Italian ryegrass or a mixture of perennial and Italian ryegrass.

Except under and in accordance with the terms of a licence 2. granted by or on behalf of the Ministry no person, between the 1st day of June, 1946, and the 31st day of May, 1947 (both dates inclusive) shall harvest for seed any ryegrass from which a crop of seed has already been harvested.

This Order shall apply only in Northern Ireland. .3.

4. This Order shall come into force on the first day of June, 1946, and may be cited as the Ryegrass (Control of Harvesting) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1946.
