ORDER, DATED 13TH SEPTEMBER, 1947, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER THE FACTORIES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1938.

1947. No. 152

The Ministry of Labour and National Insurance for Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Factories Act (Northern Ireland), 1938, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Factories (Forms and Particulars) (No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland), 1947.

2. In this Order the expression "the Act" means the Factories Act (Northern Ireland), 1938.

3. The abstract of the Act which is required by Section 120 (1) of the Act to be kept posted at the principal entrances of a factory at which employed persons enter shall be in the form N.I. 1, set out in the Schedule to this Order.

4. The abstract of the Kiers Special Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1947, required by Section 121 (1) of the Act to be kept posted up in factories to which the Regulations apply, in such characters and in such positions as to be conveniently read by the persons employed in the factory, shall be in the form N.I. 972, set out in the Schedule to this Order.

5. So much of the Factories (Forms and Particulars) Order (Northern Ireland), 1939, as deals with the Abstract of the Act, form N.I. 1, is hereby revoked.

Notification of Dangerous Occurrences

REGULATIONS, DATED 19TH JUNE, 1947, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER SECTION 69 OF THE FACTORIES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1938 (2 GEO. 6, CH. 23).

1947. No. 118

WHEREAS the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as the "Ministry") considers that, by reason of the risk of serious bodily injury to persons employed, it is expedient that notice should be given under Section 68 of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland), 1938, (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") in every case of the classes of occurrences to which these Regulations apply, whether death or disablement is caused or not ;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Ministry by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by Section 69 of the Act and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Dangerous Occurrences (Notification) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1947, and shall come into force on the 10th day of July, 1947. Short title and commencement.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. The provisions of Section 68 of the Act requiring notice of an accident occurring in a factory to be given to the Chief Inspector shall extend and apply to the classes of occurrences specified in the Schedule hereto :—

(a) in a factory ; or

Extension of the provisions relating to the notification of accidents.
