

(3) These Regulations shall be construed as one with the principal Regulations.

2.—(a) No grant shall be payable by the Ministry to the managers in respect of the attendances of students during the period 1st April to 31st July, 1948.

(b) The grant in respect of the attendance of pupils during the period commencing 1st August, 1947, and ending 31st March, 1948, shall be an amount equivalent to two-thirds of the sum which would have been paid in accordance with the provisions of the principal Regulations in respect of the school year ending 31st July, 1948, if this Regulation had not come into operation.

Technical School Examinations and other Technical Examinations

REGULATIONS, DATED 31ST OCTOBER, 1947, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION FOR NORTHERN IRELAND, UNDER SECTION 99 OF THE EDUCATION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923, AND LAID BEFORE PARLIAMENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THAT SECTION.

1947. No. 175

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Technical School Examinations Regulations, Amending Regulations, No. 2, 1947".

2. The Technical School Examinations Regulations, 1933 (Statutory Rules and Orders of Northern Ireland, 1933, No. 109) as amended by subsequent Regulations, are hereinafter referred to as The Principal Regulations.

3. The Principal Regulations shall have effect subject to the following provisions of these Regulations.

4. For Regulation 8 of the Principal Regulations, there shall be substituted the following Regulation :—

" 8. Every such form must reach the Ministry not later than the 31st January in the year in which the examinations are to be held and must be accompanied by the prescribed fees, provided, however,

that the Ministry reserves to itself the right to accept or refuse any such form received after that date up to and including the last day of February following and in the event of any such late form being accepted to charge double the ordinary fee in respect of each entry made therein. Under no circumstances may any form of entry received after the last day of February in the year in which the examinations are to be held be accepted by the Ministry."

5. Regulations 18; 19, 20 and 30 of the Principal Regulations are hereby repealed.

6. These Regulations shall be construed as one with the Principal Regulations and shall come into operation on the date hereof.

Voluntary Schools : Building and Improvement Grants

REGULATIONS, DATED 23RD DECEMBER, 1947, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UNDER SECTION 10 OF THE EDUCATION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1930, AS EXTENDED BY SECTION 7 OF THE EDUCATION (EMERGENCY PROVISIONS) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1940, WITH THE CONSENT OF THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE.

The Ministry of Education (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") in pursuance of the power vested in it by Section 10 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1930, as extended by Section 7 of the Education (Emergency Provisions) Act (Northern Ireland), 1940, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Building and Improvement Grants (Voluntary Schools) (Emergency) Regulations, 1947.

2. These Regulations shall apply to works in respect of which an application had been made by the managers of a public elementary school to the Ministry on or before the 3rd September, 1939, for a grant under sub-section (1) of section 10 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1930, where, owing to the emergency, the execution of the works which were to have been the subject of the grant had been postponed in whole or in part.
