

## SCHEDULE

## DUTIES OF FIRE OFFICERS

1. Subject to the general direction of the chief officer—
  - (a) to assume control of, and be responsible for, operations undertaken to extinguish fires and to protect life and property endangered thereby; .
  - (b) to be responsible for the training of firemen ;
  - (c) to inspect buildings and other property in order to obtain information required for the purpose of the functions of the fire authority ; and
  - (d) to give advice in respect of buildings and other property as to fire prevention, restricting the spread of fires, and means of escape in case of fire.
2. Such supervisory duties not included in the foregoing as may be assigned to them.

**Fire Districts and Fire Authorities**

ORDER, DATED 29TH MAY, 1947, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER SECTION ONE OF THE FIRE SERVICES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1947.

The Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by Section One of the Fire Services Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order :—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Fire Services (Belfast Fire District and Fire Authority) Order (Northern Ireland), 1947.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1921, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.

2. The areas of the local authorities named in the Schedule to this Order shall be combined to form a fire district to be called the Belfast Fire District.

3. The fire authority for the Belfast Fire District shall be the Council of the County Borough of Belfast.
