REGULATIONS, DATED 17TH JUNE, 1948, MADE BY THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL UNDER THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTRATION (IRELAND) ACTS, 1863 TO 1880, AND THE MARRIAGES (IRELAND) ACT, 1844, AS APPLIED BY SUBSECTION (1) OF SECTION 48 OF THE NATIONAL INSURANCE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1946.

The Registrar-General for Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the Births and Deaths Registration (Ireland) Acts, 1863 to 1880, and the Marriages (Ireland) Act, 1844, as applied by sub-section (1) of Section 48 of the National Insurance Act (Northern Ireland), 1946, and with the approbation of the Governor of Northern Ireland, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the National Insurance (Verification of Births, etc.) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1948.
- 2. Every Superintendent Registrar and every Registrar of Births, Deaths, and Marriages, and every Registrar of Marriages, on receiving from the Registrar-General a requisition for the verification of particulars relating to a birth, death, or marriage for the purposes of the National Insurance Act, (Northern Ireland), 1946, shall immediately search in the Indexes and Registers in his custody for an entry of the birth, death, or marriage (hereinafter referred to as the "event") of which particulars are given in the Requisition.

- 3.—(1) If an entry is found which appears to the Superintendent Registrar or Registrar to relate to the event, he shall mark the requisition as "found," stating the number of the entry.
- (2) If any of the particulars contained in the entry differ from the particulars given in the requisition form, or if any particulars have been omitted from the requisition form, the Superintendent Registrar or Registrar shall, in addition to marking the requisition "found" together with the number of the entry, enter in the appropriate space a copy of the particulars concerned, as they appear in the Register.
- 4. If after the requisite search has been made in the indexes and registers, no entry is found which appears to the Superintendent Registrar or Registrar to relate to the event he shall mark the requisition as "not found."
- 5. The Superintendent Registrar or Registrar shall sign and date each requisition completed as aforesaid, and return it to the Registrar-General.
- 6. The Registrar-General shall cause to be paid to the Superintendent Registrar or Registrar, at such intervals as may be approved by the Ministry of Finance, a fee of eightpence for each requisition which has been dealt with in accordance with these Regulations.

Whereas it is enacted by Section 8 of the Registration of Marriages (Ireland) Act, 1863, (as that Act applies in Northern Ireland) that the Registrar-General, with the approbation of the Governor of Northern Ireland, shall have power, from time to time as may be deemed expedient, to alter the boundaries of the Districts formed under the provisions of the Marriages (Ireland) Act, 1844, and to form new Districts:
