War Service

REGULATIONS DATED 31ST DECEMBER, 1948, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE UNDER SUBSECTION (2) OF SECTION ONE OF THE SUPER-ANNUATION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1947.

The Ministry of Finance (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry"), in exercise of the powers conferred by subsection (2) of Section 1 of the Superannuation Act (Northern Ireland), 1947 (a), (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Superannuation (War Service) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1948.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889 (b), as applied to Northern Ireland by the Interpretation Act, 1921 (c), shall apply to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. In these Regulations —

(1) "war service" means whole time service on or after the 3rd day of September, 1939, in the armed forces of the Crown, in the Merchant Navy or the Mercantile Marine, or in any of the Women's Services specified in the First Schedule to the Act;

(2) "non-effective pay" includes Naval, Military or Air Force pensions, retired pay and gratuities (other than war gratuities to which Section 23 of the Finance (No. 2) Act, 1945 (d), which exempts war gratuities from income tax, applies).

(3) "excess remuneration" means in relation to a retired officer, of the armed forces of the Crown who is re-employed in those forces, any service pension drawn in respect of such period of re-employment or any addition to the normal pay attaching to the post in which the officer is re-employed which is granted by reason of the officer's former employment in those forces;

(4) "prescribed" means prescribed by the Ministry.

3. Where a person has received non-effective pay or excess remuneration in respect of any part of his war service, then that part of his war service shall not be treated under Section 1 of the Act as service in an unestablished capacity (except if counted for the purposes of so much of Section 6 of the Act as requires a minimum period of service as a condition for the grant of a gratuity), unless :—

(1) that person makes an application to the Ministry on the prescribed form within six months of the date when he was first employed in the Civil Service of Northern Ireland, or the date of the coming into force of these Regulations (whichever is the later) or within such further time as the Ministry of Finance, having regard to the circumstances of case, may allow ; and

(2) that person satisfies the Ministry that he has refunded or is willing to refund any non-effective pay or excess remuneration in respect of any part of his war service which he desires to be treated under Section 1 of the Act as service in an unestablished capacity, and that he has surrendered his right to any further payment of non-effective pay or excess remuneration in respect of such part of his war service as aforesaid.

4. Where such adjustment as aforesaid involves the repayment of any sum the application shall not be effective until repayment is made, and when repayment falls to be made by instalments the application shall not be effective until the Department to which the payment is due has certified that repayment is complete. If repayment is not complete within two years of the date of the application then the Ministry may declare the application to be null and void.

Provided that if a person dies before repayment is completed the Ministry may treat the application as effective and may in these circumstances modify any award in respect of that person under the Superannuation Acts (Northern Ireland) 1921 to 1947 in such manner as appears to the Ministry to be equitable, having regard to the sum outstanding on account of the said repayment.
