I FURTHER CERTIFY that no other cargo is carried on the same journey, and that the vessel will proceed from the port of loading in Norway direct to the port of landing in Northern Ireland.

Order, dated 9th September, 1950, made by the Ministry of Agriculture under the Diseases of Animals Acts (Northern Ireland), 1894 to 1948.

# 1950. No. 156

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland in exercise of the powers conferred on it by or under the Diseases of Animals Acts (Northern Ireland), 1894 to 1948, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders as follows :---

### Citation, Interpretation and Commencement

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Diseases of Animals (Poultry) (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland), 1950.

(2) This Order shall be construed as one with the Diseases of Animals (Poultry) Order (Northern Ireland), 1949 (in this Order referred to as the "principal Order") and the principal Order and this Order may be cited together as the Diseases of Animals (Poultry) Orders (Northern Ireland), 1949 and 1950.

(3) This Order shall come into operation forthwith.

### Amendment of the Principal Order

2. After Article 7 of the principal Order there shall be inserted the following Article —

## "Restriction on Import of Poultry, etc.

7A.—(1) A person shall not bring or cause to be brought into Northern Ireland —

(a) any live poultry;

(b) any carcases of poultry; or

(c) any eggs for hatching;

except under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence issued by the Ministry or an officer duly authorised by the Ministry in that behalf.

#### ANIMAL

(2) Where on an application for a licence under the preceding paragraph a person satisfies the Ministry that the issue of such a licence to him would not result in, or create a risk of, the spread of disease in Northern Ireland, a licence shall be issued to that person."

3. The Import of Poultry and Eggs Order (Northern Ireland), 1947, is hereby revoked.

# Sheep Dipping

Order, dated 2nd day of August, 1950, made by the Ministry of Agriculture under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1948.

#### 1950. No. 135

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in it under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, as amended and adapted by any subsequent enactments and by every other power enabling it in that behalf, orders and it is hereby ordered as follows :---

## Prescribed Dipping

1.—(1) All sheep within Northern Ireland during the period from 2nd October to 4th November, 1950, shall, with the exceptions specified in Article 4 of the Sheep Dipping (Northern Ireland) Order of 1932, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") be dipped

- (a) on two occasions separated by an interval of not less than seven days or more than fourteen days during that period, or
- (b) on one occasion during that period provided that a "Single Type Dip" approved by the Ministry is used.

(2) The provisions of Article 8 of the principal Order with regard to the dipping of imported sheep shall apply with the modification that either of the modes of dipping specified in the preceding paragraph may be adopted.

# Notification of Intention to Dip

2. For the purpose of enabling the appropriate County Health Committee or the Divisional Veterinary Officer to be represented at the dipping or dippings required by the preceding Article whenever they think such a course desirable, the owner or person in charge of any sheep required to be dipped shall give such written notice of his intention to dip his sheep as is prescribed by Article 5 of the principal Order.
