REGULATIONS, DATED 13TH MARCH, 1950, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER SUB-SECTION (2) OF SECTION NINETY-NINE OF THE CHILDREN AND YOUNG PERSONS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1950.

## 1950. No. 38

The Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by sub-section (2) of section ninety-nine of the Children and Young Persons Act (Northern Ireland), 1950, and of all other powers enabling it on that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Children and Young Persons (Voluntary Homes) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1950, and shall come into operation on 1st April, 1950.
- 2. The particulars set out in the Schedule to these Regulations are hereby prescribed as the particulars which shall accompany any application to the Ministry for the registration of a voluntary home under Part VI of the said Act.
