

THE BRUSH AND BROOM WAGES COUNCIL (NORTHERN IRELAND) WAGES REGULATION (AMENDMENT) (No. 2) ORDER, 1951, DATED 10TH DECEMBER, 1951, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER SECTION 10 OF THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945 (9 & 10 GEO. 6, CH. 21).

1951. No. 216

WHEREAS the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") has received from the Brush and Broom Wages Council (Northern Ireland) wages regulation proposals for the amendment of the Brush and Broom Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation Order, 1948 (a) (hereinafter referred to as "Order N.I.B.B. (56)") dated the 14th day of January, 1948, as amended by the Brush and Broom Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1951 (b) (hereinafter referred to as "Order N.I.B.B. (61)") dated the 16th day of March, 1951, which fixes the minimum remuneration to be paid to the workers in relation to whom the Brush and Broom Wages Council (Northern Ireland) operates;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Ministry by virtue of section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, and of every other power in that behalf hereby makes the following Order:—

Statutory minimum remuneration and revocation. Commencement.

1. As from the specified date Order N.I.B.B. (56) shall have effect subject to the amendments set out in the Schedule to this Order, and as from that date Order N.I.B.B. (61) is hereby revoked.

2. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the 17th day of December, 1951. Provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

Short title, and interpretation.

3.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Brush and Broom Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1951.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.

WHEREAS the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") has received from the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Wages Council (Northern Ireland) wages regulation proposals for fixing the minimum remuneration to be paid to certain workers in relation to whom the Council operates in substitution for the minimum remuneration fixed by the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (No. 2) Order, 1948 (a) dated the 20th day of September, 1948, (hereinafter referred to as "Order N.I.W.D. (59)");

NOW, THEREFORE, the Ministry by virtue of section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, and of every other power in that behalf hereby makes the following Order:—
