WHEREAS the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance (hereinafter referred to as " the Ministry ") has received from the Brush and Broom Wages Council (Northern Ireland) wages regulation proposals for the amendment of the Brush and Broom Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation Order, 1948 (a) (hereinafter referred to as " Order N.I.B.B. (56) ") dated the 14th day of January, 1948, as amended by the Brush and Broom Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1951 (b) (hereinafter referred to as "Order N.I.B.B. (61)") dated the 16th day of March, 1951, which fixes the minimum remuneration to be paid to the workers in relation to whom the Brush and Broom Wages Council (Northern Ireland) operates;

Now, THEREFORE, the Ministry by virtue of section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, and of every other power in that behalf hereby makes the following Order :---

As from the specified date Order N.I.B.B. (56) shall have effect 1. subject to the amendments set out in the Schedule to this Order, and as from that date Order N.I.B.B. (61) is hereby revoked.

In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the 2. 17th day of December, 1951. Provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

3.-(1) This Order may be cited as the Brush and Broom Wages Short title, and interpre- Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1951.
